Bareboat Identifiers

The objectives of bareboat identifiers are:

- To enable ready identification of bareboats being operated within the Whitsunday Plan of Management area under a Marine Parks permit (enforcement and planning value).
- To reduce permit administration effort for Permittees, Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority (the Reef Authority) and Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service (QPWS).

An identifier is a unique identifying plate (like a number plate) that operators place on their bareboat. This plate identifies that the bareboat is being operated under a Marine Parks permit.

- Bareboat Identification Numbers (BIN) apply only to bareboat operations in the Whitsundays Plan of Management.
- It is intended that Permittees be issued with a number of unique identifiers equivalent to the number of permitted bareboats.
- Where an identifier has been issued it must be externally visible (on the port side for vessels) when operating in the Marine Parks.
- Bareboat identifiers are a yellow colour-coded rigid plastic plate (approx. 145mm x 110mm), which bear the identification number which is linked to the operator's specific permit.
- The rigid plastic plate, which is laser-etched, should be attached in a manner to allow for easy transfer between bareboats as required.
- Identifiers are produced and administered by the Reef Authority (Estimated total cost \$11.30 per BIN plus postage and handling* and an administration fee**).
- The use of identifiers will not provide operators with an ability to deviate from permit conditions or Plans of Management (e.g. passenger capacity or setting limits).

Replacement of Bareboat Identifiers

In the case of loss or damage to a bareboat identifier the Permittee must provide a statutory declaration to cover the loss of an identifier before being issued with a replacement. In the case of damage to an identifier the Permittee may pre-pay for a replacement that will be sent to their provided postal address. Permittees are to bear the cost of any replacement identifiers, applicable postage and handling and administration fees.
