



THE GREAT BARRIER REEF MARINE PARK AUTHORITY, having regard to the protection of world heritage values of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, and the precautionary principle mentioned in section 3.5.1 of the Intergovernmental Agreement on the Environment (a copy of which is set out in the Schedule to the *National Environment Protection Council Act 1994*), prepares the following plan of management under Part VB of the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975*.

Part I - Preliminary

1.1 Citation

This Plan may be cited as the Whitsundays Plan of Management.

Note: This Plan (except Part 3) commences on gazettal; see *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975*, s 39ZF(1). Part 3 of this Plan commences on the day on which regulations made under paragraph 66(2)(ba) of the Act declare that the Part takes effect; see Act, s 39ZF(2).

1.2 Interpretation

- (1) In this Plan, a word or expression mentioned in the dictionary in Schedule 11 has the meaning given in the dictionary.
- (2) A reference in this Plan to a reef or other location, followed by an identification number in brackets (for example, Line Reef (19-128)), is a reference to the reef or other location so named and identified in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Central Section Zoning Maps (specifically Hardy Reef BRA Q113 and Whitsundays BRA Q115), published by the Authority in 1937.
- (3) Where a part of a boundary of a managed location is described by reference to a line every point of which is a particular distance seaward between the nearest point of the reef or coastline to which it applies, and that boundary intersects another managed location

boundary, then in the area of overlap the boundary shall be the median line.

- (4) Where any part of a boundary of a managed location extends beyond the boundary of the Planning Area, as per Schedule 1, then that managed location boundary shall become the boundary of the Planning Area.
- (5) The lateral boundaries of an area described by reference to a line every point of which is a particular distance seaward from the nearest point of the reef or coastline to which it applies shall be the perpendiculars of that reef or coastline.
- (6) The origin of geographical coordinates used in this Plan is the Australian Geodetic Datum 1966 (AGD66).
- (7) The Information Summary and Tourism Industry Information booklets, the introductory notes and other notes do not form part of this Plan and are included ~~So~~ information only.

Part 2 - Values, use and issues of the Area

Note

Section 39Y of the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975* sets out the objects of plans of management. Those objects are:

- (a) to ensure, for particular areas of the Marine Park in which the Authority considers that nature conservation values, cultural and heritage values, or scientific values are, or may be, threatened, that appropriate proposals are developed to reduce or eliminate the threats; and
- (b) to ensure that species and ecological communities that are, or may become, vulnerable or endangered are managed to enable their recovery and continued protection and conservation; and
- (c) to ensure that activities within areas of the Marine Park are managed on the basis of ecologically sustainable use; and
- (d) to provide a basis for managing the uses of a particular area of the Marine Park that may conflict with other uses of the area or with the values of the area; and
- (e) to provide for the management of areas of the Marine Park in conjunction with community groups in circumstances where those groups have a special interest in the areas concerned; and
- (f) to enable people using the Marine Park to participate in a wide range of recreational activities.

Section 392 (1) of the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975* states that the Authority in preparing management plans must have regard to:

- (a) the protection of world heritage values of the Marine Park; and
- (b) the precautionary principle.

Division 1 - Nature conservation values and issues

2.1 Nature conservation values to be protected

- (1) For paragraph 39Y(a) of the Act, nature conservation values that the Authority considers are, or may be, threatened in the Area include:
 - (a) coral reefs and associated biota; and
 - (b) aquatic animal and plant life; and
 - (c) birds nesting or roosting in, or adjacent to, the Area; and
 - (d) scenic integrity.

- (2) For paragraph 39Y(b) of the Act, species that are, or may become, vulnerable in the Area include:
 - (a) beach stone-curlew (*Burhinus magnirostris*); and
 - (b) black-naped tern (*Sterna sumatrana*); and
 - (c) bridled tern (*Sterna anaethetus*); and
 - (d) crested tern (*Sterna bergii*); and
 - (e) lesser-crested tern (*Sterna bengalensis*); and
 - (f) eastern reef egret (*Egretta sacra*); and
 - (g) orange-footed scrub fowl (*Megapodius reinwardt*); and
 - (h) pied cormorant (*Phalacrocorax varius*); and
 - (i) pied imperial pigeon (*Ducula spilorrhoa*); and
 - (j) osprey (*Pandion haliaetus*); and
 - (k) peregrine falcon (*Falco peregrinus*); and
 - (l) white breasted sea eagle (*Haliaeetus leucogaster*).
- (3) For paragraph 39Y(b) of the Act, species that are, or may become, endangered in the Area include:
 - (a) dugong (*Dugong dugon*); and
 - (b) flatback turtle (*Natator depressus*); and
 - (c) green turtle (*Chelonia mydas*); and
 - (d) hawksbill turtle (*Eretmochelys imbricata*); and
 - (e) loggerhead turtle (*Caretta caretta*); and
 - (f) humpback whale (*Megaptera novaengliae*); and
 - (g) irrawaddy river dolphin (*Orcaella brevirostris*); and
 - (h) indo-pacific humpback dolphin (*Sousa chinensis*).

2.2 Nature conservation issues

- (1) The Authority has identified the following issues to be resolved in protecting nature conservation values:
 - (a) determining what action based on the precautionary principle to take to minimise the damaging effects to coral from anchoring, reef walking and collecting in the Area;
 - (b) how to minimise disturbance to birds, particularly when roosting and nesting, in the Area;
 - (c) how to minimise disturbance to whales, particularly in the inshore calving areas of the Area;
 - (d) how to minimise the depletion of, and pressures on, dugong populations in the Area;
 - (e) how to minimise the depletion of, and pressures on, fish populations at popular destinations in the Area;
 - (f) how to prevent the scenic integrity of the Area from being compromised by large vessels, large groups of people and the inappropriate installation of facilities.
- (2) For paragraph 39Y(c) of the Act, the Authority considers that the following activities must be managed to ensure ecologically sustainable use of the Area:
 - (a) general operation of vessels and aircraft;
 - (b) anchoring in coral reef environments;
 - (c) whale watching;

- (d) intensive fishing;
- (e) collecting;
- (f) mariculturs;
- (g) placement of facilities: and
- (h) shipping: and
- (i) access to sensitive sites.

Division 2 - Cultural and heritage values and issues

2.3 Cultural and heritage values to be protected

For paragraph 39Y (a) of the Act, cultural and heritage values of the Area that the Authority considers are, or may be, threatened include the relationship of traditional inhabitants with the marine environment and particular areas in, or adjacent to, the Area, as demonstrated by:

- (a) the existence, in the Area, of sites of cultural and heritage significance to traditional inhabitants: and
- (b) the conduct, by traditional inhabitants, of traditional subsistence activities in the Area

2.4 Cultural and heritage issues

The Authority has identified the following issues to be resolved in protecting cultural and heritage values:

- (a) how to maintain the natural values of the Area for the successful maintenance of cultural and heritage values and uses;
- (b) how to prevent contemporary cultural, heritage and use values of traditional inhabitants from being impaired by greater use of parts of the Area;
- (c) how to prevent places having high cultural and heritage values for traditional inhabitants from being compromised by inappropriate use.

Division 3 - Use of the Area and Issues

2.5 Managing use of the Area

- (1) For paragraph 39Y(c) and 39Y(d) of the **Act**, activities within the Area that the Authority considers must be managed to minimise conflict of uses or values, and managed on the basis of ecologically sustainable use of the Area, include:
 - (a) anchoring; and
 - (b) recreational activities; and
 - (c) tourist and education program activities; and
 - (d) development of coastal settlements and infrastructure; and
 - (e) traditional fishing, hunting and gathering; and
 - (f) collecting; and
 - (g) mariculture; and
 - (h) shipping; and
 - (i) research and monitoring.
- (2) For paragraph 39Y(f) of the Act, the Authority recognises that:
 - (a) the Area provides opportunities for a range of recreational activities; and

- (b) to the greatest extent practicable, consistent with subclause (1), those opportunities must be preserved.

2.6 Managing use issues

The Authority has identified the following issues to be resolved in managing those activities and preserving those opportunities:

- (a) how to ensure that extractive activities (for example, fishing, collecting and mariculture) do not conflict with other uses of the Area;
- (b) how to ensure that cultural and recreational use is not inappropriately displaced by growth in commercial use;
- (c) how to minimise disturbance to users of the Area caused by noisy and intrusive activities;
- (d) how to ensure that the remoteness of some locations is not inadvertently lost through unplanned increases in use;
- (e) how to ensure that irregular use by most users is not compromised by regular use by a few users;
- (f) how to ensure that access to popular anchorages is not constrained by the installation of facilities;
- (g) how to manage intensive use to ensure it does not devalue visitor experience at popular destinations;
- (h) how to appropriately manage the spatial distribution of tourism operations around the Area.

Part 3 - Enforcement provisions

Note

Regulations may be made providing for giving effect to the enforcement provisions of a plan of management or to the enforcement provisions of an amendment of a plan of management: see paragraph 66(2)(ba) of the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975*.

The Act also provides for offences in relation to:

- (a) the use or entry of a zone for a purpose other than a purpose permitted under a zoning plan; or
- (b) the use or entry of a zone without a relevant permission where a permission is required under the zoning plan; or
- (c) the contravention of a condition to which a relevant permission is subject.

See Act, subsection 38A, 38B and 38C.

3.1 Special access to, or use of, the Area

A provision of this part restricting access to, or use of, the Area does not apply to a person:

- (a) who is an employee of the Authority or the Queensland Department of Environment, or a member of the police force, if acting in the course of his or her duty; or
- (b) for the purpose of servicing a facility; or
- (c) for a purpose mentioned in clause 15 ("Access in special circumstances") or clause 16 ("Research") of the Central Section Zoning Plan.

Division 1 - Restrictions on access to, and activities in, the Area

3.2 Restrictions on activities near significant bird sites

A person must not operate any of the following within 1 kilometre of a significant bird site, during the restriction period for the significant bird site:

- (a) an aircraft below 1500 feet (above ground or water);
- (b) a vessel (under power) at a speed greater than 6 knots;
- (c) a horn, loud speaker or siren.

3.3 Restrictions on operating vessels or aircraft near whales

A person must not operate a vessel or aircraft (under power):

- (a) within 300 metres of a whale in the whale protection area; or
- (b) within 100 metres of a whale in the Area outside the whale protection area.

3.4 Restrictions on anchoring

A person must not anchor:

- (a) a vessel, aircraft or other facility on coral in the Area; or
- (b) a vessel or aircraft within a no anchoring area; or
- (c) a cruise ship in the Area (except in a large vessel anchoring area).

3.5 Restrictions on mooring

- (1) A person must not attach a vessel or aircraft to a public mooring in the Area:
 - (a) if the overall length of the vessel or aircraft exceeds the maximum overall length mentioned in Schedule 8 for that kind of vessel and mooring; or
 - (b) the wind strength is in excess of 24 knots; or
 - (c) for more than 2 hours -between 09:00 and 17:00 on a day.
- (2) A person must not attach a vessel or aircraft to a reef protection marker in the Area.

3.6 Restrictions on other activities

- (1) A person must not:
 - (a) operate a prescribed vessel (except in a setting 1 area); or
 - (b) engage in a motorised water sport or aerobatics in a setting 2, 3, 4 or 5 area; or
 - (c) fish in the Bait Reef no anchoring area or the Manta Ray Ray no anchoring area.
- (2) In paragraph (1)(a), a 'prescribed vessel' means a hovercraft, wing-in-ground-effect or personal water craft (including a jet-ski).

3.7 Restrictions on access to setting 1, 2, 3 and 4 areas

- (1) A person must not operate a vessel or aircraft:
 - (a) with an overall length of more than 20 metres into a setting 4 area; or
 - (b) with an overall length of more than 35 metres into a setting 2 or 3 area; or
 - (c) with an overall length of more than 70 metres into a setting 1 area; or
 - (d) carrying more than 15 people into a setting 4 area; or
 - (e) carrying more than 40 people into a setting 3 area.
- (2) A person must not operate an aircraft, below 500 feet (above ground or water), into a

setting 1, 2, 3 or 4 area unless:

- (a) landing at, or taking-off from, a managed location mentioned in Schedule 9 - in the regular aircraft landing area described for that managed location; or
 - (b) landing at, or taking-off from, any other managed location - with no more than two landings and two take-offs in any week.
- (3) Subclause (1) does not apply to a person who operates a vessel or aircraft into a setting 1, 2, 3 or 4 area:
- (a) because it is in transit, by the most direct and expeditious route practicable, to a place outside the setting area; or
 - (b) in order to access a large vessel anchoring area; or
 - (c) in accordance with a relevant permission to which clause 1.2 applies.

3.8 Restrictions on access to setting 5 areas - general

A person must not operate a vessel or aircraft into a setting 5 area (except the Hill Inlet setting 5 area).

3.9 Restrictions on access to the Hill Inlet setting 5 area

- (1) A person must not operate:
- (a) an aircraft into the Hill Inlet setting 5 area; or
 - (b) a vessel into the Hill Inlet setting 5 area (except into the Hill Inlet vessel landing area).
- (2) Paragraph (1)(b) does not apply to a vessel that is in transit, by the most direct and expeditious route practicable, to a place outside the Area.

3.10 Restrictions on access to the Hill Inlet vessel landing area

A person must not operate a vessel into the Hill Inlet vessel landing area if:

- (a) there are more than two vessels already within the vessel landing area; or
- (b) the vessel is of an overall length of more than 12 metres; or
- (c) the vessel is carrying more than 37 people.

Division 2 - Restrictions on existing relevant permissions in the Area

3.11 Restrictions on access to the Area - tourist and education programs

- (1) For the purpose of conducting a tourist or education program in the Area, a person must not operate a vessel or aircraft:
- (a) on more than 50 days per year; and
 - (b) without a booking.
- (2) Subclause (1) does not apply to a vessel or aircraft to which clause 3.12 applies.

3.12 Provision for access on more than 50 days a year - tourist and education programs

- (1) For the purpose of conducting a tourist or education program in the Area on more than 50 days per year, and without a booking, a person may operate:
- (a) a vessel or aircraft within a setting 1 area; or
 - (b) a vessel or aircraft to a private mooring; or

- (c) service equipment.
- (2) A person may also operate a vessel or aircraft in the Area, for the purpose of conducting a tourist or education program, on more than 50 days per year, and without a booking, if:
 - (a) it is a vessel or aircraft for which there is an existing relevant permission which allows more than 42 days access to the Area per year; and
 - (b) in the case of a vessel (other than a bareboat), the Environmental Management Charge logbook records for that vessel demonstrate more than 42 days use of the Area between 1/1/96 end 30/6/97, or as otherwise stated in the Regulations.
- (3) For the purpose of paragraph (2)(b), the relevant Environmental Management Charge logbook records of a previously operated vessel, that has been replaced by the current vessel, can be included.

3.13 Restrictions on certain activities - tourist and education programs

For the purpose of conducting a tourist or education program in the Area, a person must not conduct:

- (a) whale watching from a vessel - in the whale protection area; or
- (b) whale spotting:
 - (i) from a helicopter; or
 - (ii) from any other aircraft operating below 1000 feet (above ground or water); or
- (c) scenic flights from an aircraft operating below 1000 feet (above ground or water); or
- (d) a program - primarily for the purpose of vending or hiring of equipment, goods or services (except in a setting 1 area).

Part 4 - Relevant permissions

4.1 Relevant permissions to be consistent with Plan

- (1) The Authority must not grant a relevant permission that is inconsistent with Part 3 of this Plan.
- (2) A provision of this part is not to preclude the grant of a relevant permission to a person mentioned in clause 3.1 of this Plan.

Division 1 - Relevant permissions for tourist or education programs

4.2 Provision to exceed overall length and passenger load

- (1) A relevant permission for a tourist or education program in the Area may allow operation of a vessel that would, apart from this clause, be prohibited by subclause 3.7(1) if:
 - (a) it is a vessel for which there is an existing relevant permission allowing access to a setting 1, 2, 3 or 4 area that exceeds the limits mentioned in subclause 3.7(1); and
 - (b) it is a vessel to which subclause 3.12(2) applies; and
 - (c) the vessel is operated:
 - (i) into a managed location for which the Environmental Management Charge logbook records for that vessel demonstrate more than 1 days use of the managed location, in excess the limits mentioned in subclause 3.7(1), between 1/1/96 and 30/6/97, or as otherwise stated in the Regulations; or

- (ii) into any other managed location - with a hooking.
- (2) For the purpose of subparagraph (1)(c)(i), the relevant Environmental Management Charge logbook records of a previously operated vessel, that has been replaced by the current vessel, can be included.

4.3 Restrictions of conversions between styles of operation

- (1) The Authority must not grant a relevant permission so as to allow a tourist or education program involving a vessel or aircraft to convert between any of the following styles of operation:
 - (a) bareboat;
 - (b) crewed vessel;
 - (c) aircraft;
 - (d) service equipment.
- (2) Subclause (1) does not apply to one-way conversions from bareboat to crewed vessel.

4.4 Restrictions of certain activities

- (1) A relevant permission for a tourist or education program in the Area must not allow:
 - (a) whale watching from a vessel (except by the holder of an existing relevant permission which allows the conduct of whale watching in the Area); or
 - (b) reef walking - other than in the Hardy Reef or Black Island Reef managed locations (except by the holder of an existing relevant permission which allows the conduct of reef walking in the Area - other than in the Hardy Reef or Black Island Reef managed locations); or
 - (c) fishing - other than in the General Use 'K' Zone or the General Use 'B' Zone (except by the holder of an existing relevant permission which allows the conduct of fishing in the Area - other than in the General Use 'A' Zone or the General Use 'B' Zone).
- (2) Subclause (1) does not preclude approval of a transfer in accordance with 19E of the Regulations.

4.5 Bookings

- (1) The Authority must not make a booking for a tourist or education program to operate in the Area if, because of that booking:
 - (a) more than 20 vessels or aircraft (other than cruise ships) for which a booking is required could be in the Area on a day; and
 - (b) more than 1 cruise ship for which a booking is required could be in the Area on a day.
- (2) The Authority must not make a booking for a tourist or education program to operate in the Area exceeding the restrictions on overall length and passenger load mentioned in subclause 3.7(1) if, because of that booking, there would be more than 10 such bookings a year for a particular vessel.

Division 2 - Relevant permissions for other activities

4.6 Restrictions on relevant permissions for facilities

- (1) A relevant permission must not allow any of the following in the Area (except for the conduct of research):
 - (a) a permanent facility (except in a setting 1 area):

- (b) a semi-permanent facility (except in a setting 1 area or the Hardy Reef managed location).
- (2) However, a relevant permission may allow a private mooring in a setting 2 or 3 area if the relevant permission is for a person who holds an existing relevant permission for the mooring.

4.7 Restrictions on relevant permissions for collecting or mariculture

A relevant permission must not allow collecting, other than limited collecting, or mariculture in the Area (except for the purpose of research) unless the permission is for:

- (a) the holder of an existing relevant permission for collecting or mariculture in the Area: and
- (b) a period that expires before the end of 10 years after the commencement of this Plan.

SCHEDULE 1

Subclause 1.2(1)

WHITSUNDAY PLANNING AREA

The Whitsundays Planning Area comprises:

- (a) the area of the Marine Park the boundary of which:
 - (i) commences on the coastline of the mainland at low-water, at the northernmost point of Cape Gloucester (latitude 20°04'02" south, longitude 148°27'27" east);
 - (ii) then runs north-westerly along the geodesic to the point of latitude 19°58'07" south, longitude 148°18'32" east;
 - (iii) then easterly along the geodesic to the point of latitude 19°58'01" south, longitude 149°12'14" east;
 - (iv) then southerly along the geodesic to the point of latitude 20°32'26" south, longitude 149°12'12" east;
 - (v) then westerly along the geodesic to its intersection by the coastline of the mainland at low-water at the point of latitude 20°40'04" south, longitude 148°42'39" east, in the vicinity of Midge Point; and
 - (vi) then northerly, easterly, south-easterly and north-westerly along the coastline of the mainland at low-water to the point of commencement; and
- (b) the area of the Marine Park the boundary of which:
 - (i) commences at the point of latitude 19°51'14" south, longitude 149°02'43" east;
 - (ii) then runs northerly along the geodesic to the point of latitude 19°36'25" south, longitude 149°02'39" east;
 - (iii) then easterly along the geodesic to the point of latitude 19°36'20" south, longitude 149°17'41" east;
 - (iv) then southerly along the geodesic to the point of latitude 19°51'07" south, longitude 149°17'47" east; and
 - (v) then westerly along the geodesic to the point of commencement.

SCHEDULE 2

Subclause 1.2(1)

SETTIYG AREAS

PART 1 - SETTING 1 AREAS

A Setting 1 area refers to the parts (1-9) of the Area described below:

1. Hayman Island Resort:

The area, the boundary of which:

- (a) commences on the coastline of Hayman Island at low-water at its southernmost point, in the vicinity of Groper Point;
- (b) thence south-westerly along the geodesic to its intersection by the coastline of Langford Island at low-water at its easternmost point;
- (c) thence north-westerly along the coastline of Langford Island at low-water to its northernmost point;
- (d) thence north-easterly along the geodesic to the point of intersection of the coastline of Hayman Island at low-water by the parallel of latitude 20°03'35" south; and
- (e) thence easterly along the coastline of Hayman Island at low-water to the point of commencement.

2. Dingo Beach Settlement:

The area enclosed within the coastal 500 metre line of the stretch of mainland coastline at low-water between its intersection by the meridian longitude 148°28'59" east and its intersection by the meridian of longitude 148°29'46" east.

3. Earlando's Resort:

The area, the boundary of which

- (a) commences on the mainland coastline at low-water at its intersection by the meridian of longitude 148°34'32" east;
- (b) thence southerly along the geodesic to the point of intersection of the mainland coastline at low-water and the parallel of latitude 20°09'22" south; and
- (c) thence northerly along the mainland coastline at low-water to the point of commencement.

4. Hook Island Observatory and Resort:

The area, the boundary of which:

- (a) commences on the coastline of Hook Island at low-water at its intersection by the parallel of latitude 20°10'01" south;
- (b) thence south-easterly along the perpendicular to its intersection by the coastal 500 metre line of Hook Island;
- (c) thence north-westerly along the geodesic to the point of intersection of the coastline of Hook Island at low-water by the parallel of latitude 20°09'29" south; and
- (d) thence south-westerly along the coastline of Hook Island at low-water to the point of commencement.

5. Daydream and South Molle Island Resorts:

The area, the boundary of which:

- (a) commences on the coastline of Daydream Island at low-water at its northernmost point;
- (b) thence northerly along the meridian to its intersection by the coastal 500 metre line of Daydream Island;

- (c) thence south-easterly along the geodesic to its intersection by the southernmost point of the coastline of Mid Molle Island at low-water;
- (d) thence easterly along the geodesic to the easternmost point of intersection of the coastal 500 metre line of South Molle Island by the meridian of longitude 148°50'53" east;
- (e) thence southerly along the meridian to its intersection by the coastline of South Molle Island at low-water, in the vicinity of Deedes Point;
- (f) thence south-westerly along the coastline of South Molle Island at low-water to its westernmost point, in the vicinity of Ker Point;
- (g) thence north-westerly along the geodesic to its intersection by the coastal 500 metre line of Daydream Island at its southernmost point ;
- (h) thence north-westerly along the coastal 500 metre line of Daydream Island to its westernmost point;
- (i) thence easterly along the parallel to its intersection by the coastline of Daydream Island at low-water; and
- (j) thence southerly along the coastline of Daydream Island at low-water to the point of commencement.

6. Happy and Palm Bay Resorts, Long Island:

The area, the boundary of which:

- (a) commence on the coastline of Long Island at low-water at its intersection by the parallel of latitude 20°20'47" south;
- (b) thence westerly along the parallel to its intersection by the coastal 500 metre line of Long Island;

- (b) thence south-easterly along the geodesic to the point of latitude 20°14'35" south, longitude 149°01'47" east;
- (c) thence south-westerly along the geodesic to the point of latitude 20°15'08" south, longitude 149°01'17" east;
- (d) thence north-westerly along the geodesic to the point of intersection of the coastline of Hook Island at low-water by the meridian of longitude 149°01'04" south; and
- (e) thence north-easterly along the coastline of Whitsunday Island at low-water to the point of commencement.

anchor means temporarily attach to the seabed by means of a weighted object.

Area means the Whitsunday Planning Area described in Schedule 1 (and depicted generally in the map set out on the cover of this Plan).

Bait Reef no anchoring area means the area described in item 1 of Schedule 6.

bareboat means a vessel with an overall length of more than 6 metres that is available for timeshare, hire or charter without a shipmaster.

beach equipment has the meaning it is given in subregulation 34(1) of the Regulations.

booking means a booking made with the Authority, and confirmed in writing by the Authority, to **operate** a vessel or aircraft into the area mentioned in the booking on the date mentioned in the booking.

Central Section means the area assigned the name "Great Barrier Reef Marine Park - Central Section" by Proclamation made under subsection 31(1) of the Act and published in the *Gazette* on 15 October 1984.

collecting has the same meaning as in the zoning plan.

cruise ship means a vessel with an overall length of more than 70 metres.

day means a **24** hour period commencing at midnight.

education program has the meaning it is given in subsection 3A(6) of the Act.

existing relevant permission means a relevant permission in force at the commencement of this Plan.

fishing has the same meaning as in the zoning plan.

General Use 'A' Zone means the zone so named in the zoning plan.

General Use 'B' Zone means the zone so named in the zoning plan.

Hill Inlet setting 5 area means the area described in item 5 of Part 5 of Schedule 2

Hill Inlet vessel landing area means the area described in Schedule 10.

large vessel means a vessel with an overall length of more than 35 metres.

large vessel anchoring area means an area described in Schedule 7.

limited collecting has the same meaning as in the zoning plan.

managed location means the part of the Area that is within:

- (a) the 500 metre line of a reef mentioned in column 1 of Schedule 3; or
- (b) the coastal 500 metre line of an island, rock or embayment mentioned in column 1 of Schedule 3; or
- (c) the coastal 500 metre line of any other stretch of coastline mentioned in column 2 of Schedule 3.

Manta Ray Bay no anchoring area means the area described in item 2 of Schedule 6.

Marine Park means the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park.

mooring facility means a semi-permanent facility that is designed solely for mooring a vessel or aircraft, and includes the mooring buoy, tackle and the point of attachment to the seabed.

motorised water sport means a recreational activity in which a person is towed by a motorised vessel or aircraft, or uses a personal water craft (for example, water-skiing, jet-skiing and parasailing).

no anchoring nrca means an area described in Schedule 6.

permanent facility means a facility that is built on the seabed and remains in the same place for more than 40 days in any period of 60 days.

personal water craft has the same meaning as described in the Queensland *Transport Operations (Marine Safety) Act*.

private mooring means a mooring that is not a public mooring.

public mooring means a mooring that is:

- (a) installed by, or on behalf of, the Authority or the State of Queensland, for use by the public; or
- (b) installed by the Authority for use by the Authority.

reef has the same meaning as in the zoning plan.

reef edge has the same meaning as in the zoning plan.

reef protection marker means a white pyramid-shaped buoy, bearing a blue Marine Park symbol, that is installed by, or on behalf of, the Authority to mark the seaward boundary of a no anchoring area.

regular aircraft landing area means an area described in Schedule 9.

Regulations means the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations.

relevant permission has the same meaning as in the Regulations.

restriction period, for a significant bird site, means the period mentioned in Schedule 4 for the significant bird site.

semi-permanent facility means a buoyant facility that is attached to the seabed and remains in the same place for more than 40 days in any period of 60 days.

setting 1 area means an area described in Part 1 of Schedule 2.

setting 2 area means an area described in Part 2 of Schedule 2.

setting 3 area means an area described in Part 3 of Schedule 2.

setting 4 area means an area described in Part 4 of Schedule 2.

setting 5 area means an area described in Part 5 of Schedule 2.

service equipment means beach equipment, dinghies, motorised water sports equipment, semi-submersible boats and glass-bottomed boats - up to 6 metres in overall length.

significant bird site means an island, islet, rock, inlet or bay mentioned in Schedule 4 (to the coastline at low-water).

taking has the same meaning as in the zoning plan.

the 100 metre line means, in relation to a reef, an assumed line every point of which is at a distance of 100 metres seaward from the nearest point of the reef edge and **the 500 metre line**, **the 1000 metre line** and **the 1500 metre line** have corresponding meanings.

the coastal 500 metre line means an assumed line, every point of which, is:

- (a) at low-water, at a distance of 500 metres seaward from the nearest point of the coastline concerned; or
- (b) where there is a fringing reef wholly or partly along the coastline concerned - at low-water, at a distance of 500 metres seaward from the nearest point of the reef edge of the fringing reef; and

the coastal 200 metre line, **the coastal 1000 metre line** and **the coastal 1500 metre line** have corresponding meanings.

the precautionary principle means the following principle mentioned in section 3.5.1 of the Intergovernmental Agreement on the Environment (a copy of which is set out in the Schedule to the *National Environment Protection Council Act 1994*);

"Where there are threats of serious or irreversible environmental damage, lack of full scientific certainty should not be used as a reason for postponing measures to prevent environmental degradation."

week means a period of 7 days commencing on a Monday.

whale protection area means the area described in Schedule 5.

year means a calendar year.

zoning plan means **the** zoning plan for the Central Section that came into force in 1987.
