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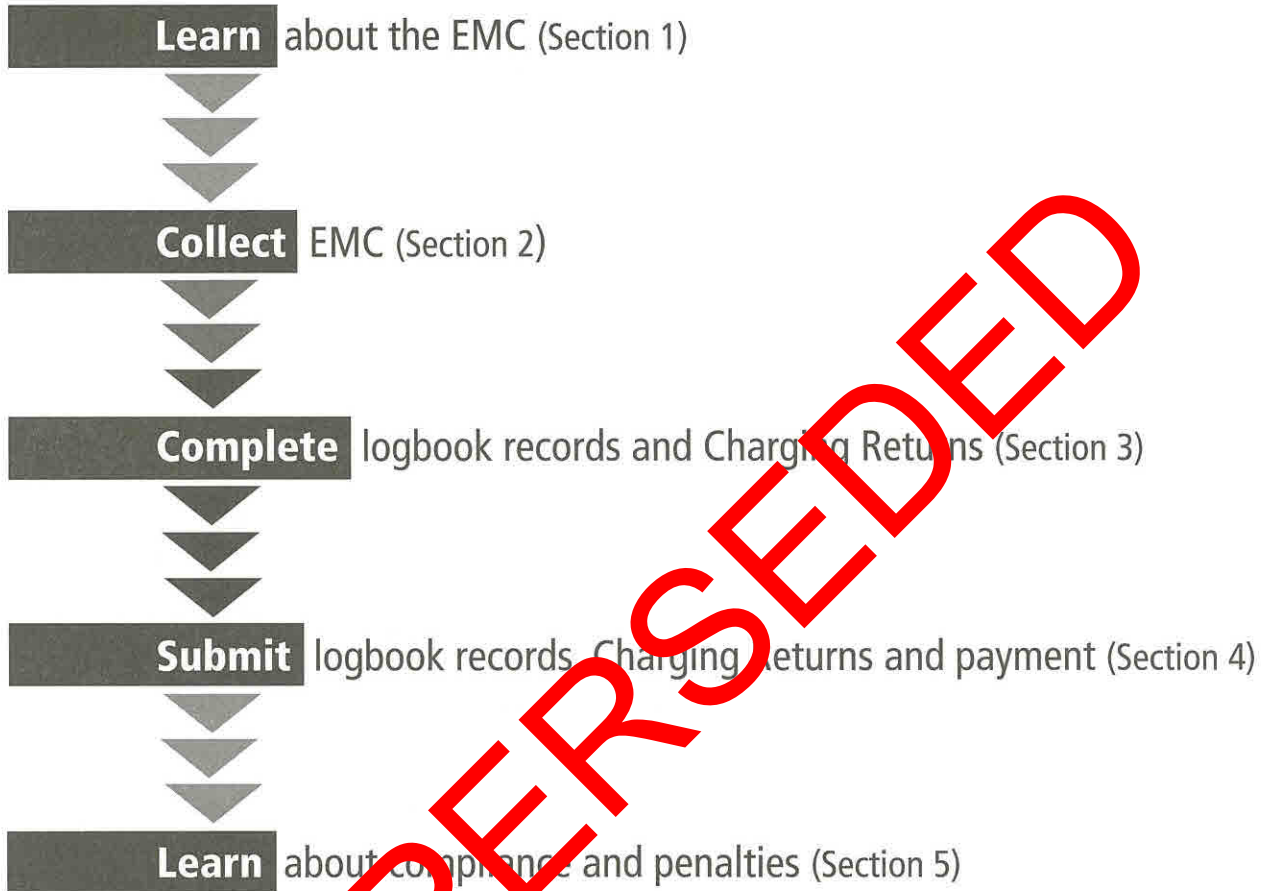
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Your EMC Obligations in Five Easy Steps

The Great Barrier Reef is an outstanding natural ecosystem that supports a world-class array of species and habitats. Almost two million tourists visit this World Heritage Area every year, motivated primarily by the chance to see, experience and learn about the Great Barrier Reef.

We can all play a role in protecting the Great Barrier Reef and preserving the tourism experiences it offers.

As an important stakeholder, you contribute to the management of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park by collecting and submitting the Environmental Management Charge and visitation records. You can further contribute by working in partnership with the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority in Marine Park management.

The funds the Australian Government receives from the Environmental Management Charge are vitally important in the day-to-day management of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park and in improving its long-term resilience. At the same time, the visitation information you provide when submitting the Environmental Management Charge greatly assists the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority in developing management arrangements for sustainable use of the Marine Park.

The Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority continually works to improve the way the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park is managed. A current focus is the permitting system and the Environmental Management Charge. Staged implementation of improvements in these areas will mean more streamlined processes and a simpler and easier system for you.

You are encouraged to carefully read this guide to the Environmental Management Charge. This 2011 EMC guide contains information relevant to the **2011 calendar year**. It will help you understand your Environmental Management Charge obligations and guide you through the steps to meeting them.

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1 About the Environmental Management Charge (EMC)

1.1 What is the EMC?

The EMC is a charge associated with most commercial activities, including tourism operations, non-tourist charter operations and facilities, operated under a permit issued by the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority (GBRMPA).

For most tourism operations, visitors to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park (Marine Park) participating in a tourist activity are liable to pay the charge to the permittee, who then remits the charge to the GBRMPA.

Other operations in the Marine Park such as those involving the hire of equipment, installation and operation of tourist facilities, underwater observatories, sewage outfalls and vending operations, the permittee must pay fixed quarterly charges to the GBRMPA.

1.2 How is the EMC used?

The funds collected through the EMC are vital to protecting and managing the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, one of the largest and best known World Heritage Areas on the planet. All funds received as EMC payments are applied directly to management of the Marine Park, including education and research, compliance patrol, site planning, public moorings, reef protection markers, information signs and maps.

Visitation numbers collected as part of the EMC reporting process are also very important to Marine Park management. This information, when combined with information regarding the health of the Great Barrier Reef ecosystem, assists the GBRMPA to design management arrangements that support the continued sustainable use of the area, and its ongoing resilience.

1.3 What are your obligations?

With regard to the EMC, the role of the permittee is to collect (where appropriate) and remit the charge to the GBRMPA by the due date in accordance with Part 8 of the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 1983* (the Regulations).

As a permittee in the Marine Park, you are responsible for:

- Collecting the correct amount of the EMC from individual visitors for tourist related operations and non-tourist charter passengers
- Keeping accurate and up-to-date records of the EMC
- For most operations, submitting the logbooks to the GBRMPA by the due date, even where there is no activity
- Remitting all payments quarterly to the GBRMPA by the due date for tourist related operations and non-tourist charter passengers
- Remitting fixed quarterly charges to the GBRMPA by the due date for tourist related services – for example, beach hire and pontoons and non-tourist related services and structures
- Accurately advertising the EMC.

Regardless of private business arrangements you may make, you are reminded that as the permittee you have the responsibility to ensure compliance with the conditions of your permit and to ensure the full and timely lodgement of all EMC returns and payments.

1.4 Does the GST apply?

You are not required to pay GST on any EMC collected.

1.5 Will the EMC increase?

The EMC is linked to the Consumer Price Index (all groups) for Brisbane. Increases take place on 1 April during years when the accumulated indexed calculation reaches \$0.40 or more. The GBRMPA will notify operators of any increases to the EMC at least 12 months in advance.

1.6 Are there any recent changes?

Since late 2010 the GBRMPA has been implementing a new integrated, easy-to-use information system to manage permits and the EMC, known as Reef Permits.

Over the coming months you will notice improvements to the way we do business that will make it easier for you to manage your permit and EMC obligations. In particular, we are moving towards electronic lodgement of information and on-line applications.

The introduction of Reef Permits will bring with it some new terminology that you should understand:

- **Operation** – refers to the individual components of your permitted tourism business. An operator may hold a tourism permit that allows more than one **operation** - for example, a pontoon, a tour vessel, a guided tour and beach hire. With regard to the EMC, separate information must be supplied for each one of these **operations**.
- **Authorised contact** – refers to a person who is nominated to act on behalf of a permittee in a variety of roles, such as administration, permit applications, bookings and management of EMC obligations.

2 Collecting the EMC

2.1 Who must pay?

Visitors in a tourist program

Most commonly, it is visitors to the Marine Park participating in a tourist activity who must pay the EMC. This charge is collected by the tourism permittee and remitted to the GBRMPA on a quarterly basis.

The term 'visitor' is defined in the Regulations as meaning:

- a tourist; and
- any other person who is provided with a service in the Marine Park under a tourist program.

In calculating the amount of EMC due and owing, you are required by the Regulations to count visitors as defined above. There are some exemptions to this requirement to pay the EMC (see Section 2.2).

Staff or crew who are on duty should not be counted as visitors. However, if they are off duty and taking part in your tourist program, they are considered to be visitors and must be included.

EMC must be collected for visitors travelling on discounted fares, including children aged four years or older and pensioners.

Non-tourist charter passengers

EMC must be collected from passengers who are undertaking non-tourist vessel charters and remitted to the GBRMPA on a quarterly basis.

Permittees who provide services, structures and facilities

Permittees must pay fixed quarterly charges for:

- Beach hire equipment
- Installation and operation of tourist facilities
- Underwater observatories
- Sewage outfalls
- Vending operations.

2.2 Are there exemptions?

EMC should **not** be collected from visitors who are carried Free-of-Charge (FOC) and are:

- Children less than four years old
- Beneficiaries of registered charities
- Supervised school groups
- Tourism industry trade familiarisations
- Media reporters and broadcasters reporting on Marine Park issues.

EMC should **not** be collected from:

- Visitors who have already paid the **full** EMC for that day to another operator.
- Visitors who are on their fourth and subsequent days of an extended trip with one operator, providing the visitor has paid the maximum charge of \$16.50.
- Transfer passengers who transit the Marine Park and for whom the permittee does not provide any tourism activities for two hours after disembarkation.
- Passengers who visit the Queensland Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park ONLY.

You are required to keep records of any exemptions for at least two years.

2.3 How much is the EMC?

To understand exactly how much EMC you need to collect and pay, please carefully check the fee schedule.

This is a summary of the relevant provisions of Part VA of the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975* (the Act) and Part 8 of the Regulations. Any person affected by the EMC should also consult the Act and Regulations and/or seek advice in relation to their liability.

Environmental Management Charge Fee Schedule 2011

Tourist related visitors – daily charges

Full-day visitors

Permittee to collect from each visitor **\$5.50 per day** for:

- Trips of three hours or more
- Trips entering the Marine Park before 5.00 pm
- Trips leaving the Marine Park after 6.00 am
- First three days of an extended charter
- Any visitors who are on the fourth or subsequent days of an extended charter with a different operator and who then participates in your tourist operation.

Part-day visitors

Permittee to collect from each visitor **\$2.75** for:

- Trips less than three hours
- The first day of a trip entering the Marine Park after 5.00 pm
- The last day of a trip leaving the Marine Park before 6.00 am.

Semi-submersible and glass-bottomed boat excursions

A trip to conduct a Coral Viewing Program provides for a stand-alone activity involving an excursion for visitors to view coral and fish from a semi-submersible or glass-bottomed boat. Please note that this does not include glass-bottomed and semi-submersible excursions which are ancillary to another tourist program.

Permittee to collect from each visitor **40 cents per excursion**.

If a visitor participates in more than one excursion on the same day and all the excursions are provided under the same permit, the visitor only pays for the first excursion.

Sight-seeing flights

Permittee to collect from each visitor **40 cents per excursion**.

If a visitor participates in more than one excursion on the same day and all the excursions are provided under the same permit, the visitor only pays for the first excursion.

Tourist related services and structures – fixed quarterly charges

Beach hire

Charges are based on the equipment listed on the permit. The permittee must pay the EMC even when there was no activity.

Non-motorised beach hire

- Less than six pieces of equipment: \$12 per quarter
- Six or more pieces of equipment: \$25 per quarter.

Dinghy hire

A dinghy is a small open boat having no designed sleeping accommodation. It does not include half-cabin boats.

- Less than six dinghies: \$50 per quarter
- Six or more dinghies: \$12 per dinghy per quarter.

Motorised water sports

- If the equipment is jet boats (e.g. jet skis) designed to carry no more than two persons: \$25 per quarter
- If the equipment includes no jet boats: \$62 per quarter
- If the equipment is jet boats and other motorised equipment: \$87 per quarter.

Installations and tourist facilities

Pontoons

Pontoons include tourist, helicopter and swim pontoons.

- An area less than or equal to 40m²: \$90 per quarter
- An area greater than 40m²: \$180 per quarter.

Floating hotels

- \$280 per quarter.

Underwater observatories (other than those attached to pontoons)

- \$130 per quarter.

Non-tourist charter passengers - daily charges

This category applies to commercial vessels available for charter operations to conduct non-tourist activities (e.g. surveys, research, commercial filmmaking and delivery of goods/crew). Passengers only pay for one day, regardless of the length of the trip.

Non-tourist charter operations - **\$2 per person per trip.**

Non-tourist related services and structures – fixed quarterly charges

Vending operations

- \$30 per metre of the length of the vessel per quarter.

The general mode of operation of such vessels is for the sale of goods or services from a vessel. No visitors are carried.

Marinas

- \$380 per quarter (for construction or operation).

Mariculture

- \$500 per quarter for the first 10 hectares plus \$200 per quarter for each additional 10 hectares.

The charge applies to the establishment or operation of farming facilities for the culture of pearls and clams.

Land-based sewage discharge:

This charge applies to land-based marine outfalls only.

- If the sewage has received tertiary treatment: \$400 per quarter.

Note: Sewage that has received secondary treatment may be taken to have received tertiary treatment if not more than five per cent of the annual volume of secondary treated sewage effluent generated, is discharged into the Marine Park at a land-based outfall.

- If sewage has received primary and secondary treatment only: \$400 per quarter plus a charge based on a cost per unit nutrient using the formula: $\$4,000 \times V \times (N+P)$.

Where: **V** is the total volume of sewage, expressed in megalitres, discharged in the quarter.

N is the concentration, expressed as milligrams per litre, of all forms of nitrogen.

P is the concentration, expressed as milligrams per litre, of all forms of phosphorous.

2.4 Information for your customers

Advertising

As a Marine Park permittee, your obligation to collect the EMC from visitors includes correctly representing the amount of the EMC when advertising fare prices.

It is your responsibility to ensure consistency across all media including websites, brochures, television advertising, tax invoices and receipts.

The GBRMPA supports permittees who choose to incorporate the EMC into their overall ticket price and there is no requirement to state the fee separate to the ticket price.

However, where additional fees and charges are advertised, and you have chosen to advertise or collect the EMC separate to the ticket price then you must ensure that a consumer can readily identify the correct EMC component.

Examples of correct EMC advertising include:

- Total price - \$....
- Total price - \$.... including Environmental Management Charge of \$5.50
- Total price - \$.... including fees/charges \$.... (including Environmental Management Charge - \$5.50).

You need to be aware that it is a criminal offence under the Act to make a false or misleading representation of the EMC.

You should refer to the *Trade Practices Act 1974* for other requirements of price advertising.

Educating your visitors

When collecting the EMC from your visitors you are encouraged to inform them about the EMC, how much they are required to pay and what the money is used for.

By paying the EMC, your visitors are helping the protection, conservation and ecologically sustainable use of this unique and amazing coral reef environment.

You can help them understand the positive contribution they are making to the sustainable future of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park and World Heritage Area.

To make it easier to explain to your passengers about the EMC, its role in management, and how much each visitor pays, a full colour poster is available on the GBRMPA website at www.gbrmpa.gov.au/onboard and then click on EMC.

3 Completing your logbooks and Charging Returns

3.1 How do I provide the required information?

The GBRMPA provides you with EMC logbooks and Charging Returns when your permit is granted and at the beginning of each calendar year. They are available both electronically and in a hard-copy form.

The hard copy 2011 Logbook for Vessel Programs contains a new column to record stand alone semi-submersible and glass-bottomed boat excursions.

If you are undertaking activities for which the **daily EMC charges apply**, you are required to complete your logbook on a daily basis. This includes information on the number of visitors carried, the amount of EMC payable and all the reefs, islands and bays visited.

You must complete a separate logbook for each operation (see Section 1.2) permitted. Examples on how to fill out your logbook are provided on the next page.

Please take care to complete the logbook accurately, paying particular attention to:

- Providing correct information about the permit you are operating
- Ensuring information for each operation on a permit is recorded, even if there was no activity
- Providing correct details of the location(s) you operated to (Reef ID's can be found on the GBRMPA Zoning Maps or in Appendix A of this guide).

You must also complete a Charging Return every quarter for each operation. This is a summary of the information from the logbook regarding the amount of EMC due. Please note you will find your Reference Number on the front of the Charging Return.

If you are undertaking activities with a **fixed quarterly charge**, such as beach hire, land-based sewage discharge or mariculture, you are only required to complete a quarterly Charging Return. Please note you will find your Reference Number on the front of the Charging Return.

For multiple permits or vessels -

In addition to the quarterly Charging Return, please fill out a Charging Return summary form if you have any of the following:

- Multiple operations (including multiple vessels on the one permit)
- Multiple permits

You will need to contact the GBRMPA and register as a multi-permit user. You will also be provided with a Charging Return summary form which must be submitted to the GBRMPA with your Charging Returns.

3.2 What happens if I did not operate?

Charging Returns must be submitted for operations even if you did not operate during the relevant quarter. This can be recorded on a Nil Return form as **nil activity**. Nil Return forms can be obtained by contacting the GBRMPA on (07) **4750 0700** or by emailing emc@gbmpa.gov.au.

- When you did not operate during a quarter, a Nil Return must be submitted for each operation under which there was no activity
- When you did not operate because you have hired your vessel to another permittee who is conducting their own tourist program under their own permit, a Nil Return must be submitted. The other permittee is required to collect any EMC and submit their own returns.

3.3 Electronic logbooks

Permittees with bareboat and aircraft operations are required to submit electronic logbooks. These electronic logbooks will be supplied to permittees and are also available for download on the GBRMPA website www.gbrmpa.gov.au.

The GBRMPA encourages all permittees to complete and submit their EMC activities in electronic logbooks which are available for all operation types.

If you would like to submit electronic copies please email emc@gbmpa.gov.au.

3.4 Completing your quarterly Charging Returns

Beach hire programs: You are not required to keep daily logbooks but must complete a quarterly Charging Return.

Pontoon operations: You are not required to keep daily logbooks but must complete a quarterly Charging Return.

Vending and mariculture operations: You are not required to keep daily logbooks but must complete a quarterly Charging Return.

Land based sewage discharge: You are not required to keep daily logbooks but must complete a quarterly Charging Return.

4 How to submit logbooks, Charging Returns and payment

4.1 Due dates

Payment of the EMC with the Charging Return and logbook sheets (where applicable) must be submitted quarterly to the GBRMPA. At the end of each quarter, you have the next month to collate your logbook sheets and Charging Returns and submit them and the payment to the GBRMPA.

The due dates are:

Dates of Quarters	Due Date
1 January to 31 March	30 April
1 April to 30 June	31 July
1 July to 30 September	31 October
1 October to 31 December	31 January

4.2 Payment options

You may make an EMC payment by BPAY, cheque, credit card, direct deposit or internet banking. To ensure that your payment can be accurately matched to your EMC obligations, you must clearly identify each payment with your Reference Number.

BPAY

- To pay EMC using BPAY, quote the Biller Code and provide your Reference Number located on the front of your Charging Return.

Direct deposit

- Bank details for the GBRMPA may be obtained by contacting the EMC unit on (07) 4750 0700 or by email at emc@gbmpa.gov.au
- Ensure you identify your payment by including your Reference Number in your payment description.

Cheques

- Please make cheques payable to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority.

Credit card

To pay by credit card, contact the GBRMPA on (07) 4750 0700.

Please note that any bank charges incurred from credit institutions for processing transactions will be added to the final payment amount.

5 EMC compliance and penalties

You are legally required to meet all your EMC obligations such as maintaining appropriate records and providing information and payments by the due dates. Permits may be suspended and ultimately revoked if permittees do not meet their obligations.

5.1 EMC timelines

Permittees collect EMC data on a daily basis over the three months of the quarter. The EMC timelines then allow permittees one month to collate this data and submit it to the GBRMPA along with the required remitted charges. The absolute final date for the submission of logbooks and payment is the last day of the month following the end of the quarter. However, the GBRMPA encourages permittees to meet their EMC obligations prior to this date. Both logbooks and payments received after the final due date immediately incur a Late Payment Penalty which is detailed below. Failure to meet EMC obligations may lead to the suspension of the permit and subsequent revocation of the permit.

5.2 Late Payment Penalty

If you fail to pay the EMC by the due date you will be liable to pay a Late Payment Penalty (LPP).

The LPP is calculated as the greater of either \$250 or 20 per cent per annum of the amount owing, calculated from the due date of payment.

5.3 Permit suspension and revocation

Permits may be suspended if the permittee fails to comply with the regulations requiring the provision of information, Charging Returns, logbook pages and payments.

It is illegal for you to operate in the Marine Park if your permit is suspended.

If your permit has been suspended because your logbook sheets, returns, and/or payment (including the LPP) have not been submitted by the due date, you must submit the paperwork and payment and pay a **reinstatement fee of \$120** to end the suspension of your permit.

Permits may be revoked 10 business days after a permit is suspended if the outstanding EMC requirements have not been met. This would mean that you no longer have a permit to operate in the Marine Park.

5.4 Court-imposed penalties

If you fail to meet other relevant legal requirements, the Court may impose the following penalties:

Failure to give information or returns

Maximum penalty \$4400 for an individual and \$22 000 for a corporation.

Failure to pay collected amount to the GBRMPA

Maximum penalty \$1100 per day for an individual and \$5500 per day for a corporation up to

a maximum of 21 days (in addition to a penalty amount equal to the amount of the charge payable and a LPP).

Failure to collect a charge from a visitor

Maximum penalty \$5500 for an individual and \$27 500 for a corporation (in addition to a penalty amount equal to the amount of the charge and a Late Payment Penalty).

Not keeping proper records

Maximum penalty \$5500 for an individual and \$27 500 for a corporation.

Altering records to claim exemption

Maximum penalty \$5500 for an individual and \$27 500 for a corporation.

Not retaining records for two years

Maximum penalty \$5500 for an individual and \$27 500 for a corporation.

Not recording information in the logbook supplied or in a form approved by the GBRMPA

Maximum penalty \$5500 for an individual and \$27 500 for a corporation.

5.5 Infringement notices

You could be issued with an infringement notice for breaches of record keeping requirements.

In this case, breaches are dealt with by an infringement notice instead of progressing the matter through the Court. However, you may elect to have the matter dealt with by the Court.

Infringement notices may be issued for:

- Not keeping proper records: penalty \$550
- Altering records to claim exemption: penalty \$770
- Not retaining records for two years: penalty \$550
- Not recording information in the logbook supplied or in a form approved by the GBRMPA: penalty \$550.

Please note penalty amounts are current at the date of printing this guide but may change.

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The Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975 requires the GBRMPA to assess and collect charges imposed by the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park (Environmental Management Charge - General) Act 1993* and the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park (Environmental Management Charge - Excise) Act 1993*.

The information provided by you will be used to assess your liability to pay an EMC. For this reason, it is a requirement under the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 1983* for holders of charged permissions to give to the GBRMPA copies of EMC logbook entries and Charging Return forms at quarterly intervals.

If you make an application to the GBRMPA for a permission, the information you provide may also be used to assist the GBRMPA to assess your application, by enabling it to determine if you have any outstanding EMC liability. The authority to consider this information is in the Regulations.

Further, in assessing your application for a permission, the information you provide may be used to assess whether you have made reasonable use of any permission previously granted to you.

EMC information

The GBRMPA will not disclose personal information you provide on these forms to any third party without your consent, unless otherwise authorised by law.

However, the GBRMPA may use some of the information you provide to create aggregated statistical data, which it may pass on to other departments and organisations, such as the Queensland Department of Environment and Resource Management (DERM), the Association of Marine Park Tourism Operators (AMPTO), Port Authorities and the Tourism and Recreation Reef Advisory Committee (TRRAC) and make available in publications and its website.
