
1 About Marine Parks permits

1.1 What is a Marine Parks permit?

Marine Parks permits are legal documents which reflect the decision to grant a permit to a company or individual, giving them permission/s to operate or carry out activities within the Marine Parks. A Marine Parks permit is generally two permits in one — a permit to operate in the Commonwealth Great Barrier Reef Marine Park and a permit to operate in the Queensland State Marine Parks, located within or adjacent to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park.

A permit describes:

- the Commonwealth and state permission/s granted
- what activities are permitted
- the conditions under which the activities can occur (these are in addition to what is already laid out in law including the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975* (the Marine Park Act), Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 1983 (the Regulations), the Great Barrier Reef Marine Parks Zoning Plan 2003, relevant plans of management and any relevant state legislation)



1.2 How to be a responsible permittee

When operating is the Greet Barrer Reef Marine Park and Queensland State Marine Parks, you must comply with legal requirements contained. The relevant Acts, Regulations, zoning plans, plans of management and your permit. You should be familiar with the requirements that relate to your activities in the places you are visiting, and are encouraged to adopt best environmental practices. For more information visit www.gbrmpa.gov.au.

Know your permit

Permits are legal documents. It is your responsibility to ensure you understand and comply with all parts of your permit. To help you better understand the document, start reading your permit by checking the sections titled 'Interpretation' and 'Definitions' towards the end of the permit. If you require clarification or don't understand your permit conditions, contact permitscompliance@gbrmpa.gov.au.

The expiry date can be found in the top left-hand corner of the first page of your permit. If you wish to continue operations beyond the expiry date, you must submit a new application before the expiry date. This allows you to continue operating in accordance with your existing permit until a decision is made on your application for another permit.

Your permit number can be found on the top right-hand corner of your permit. Quote this number in all correspondence with GBRMPA and the Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service (QPWS).

Know who holds responsibility for the permit

Marine Parks permits are granted to a 'permittee'. The name of the permittee is stated on the first page of your permit, and may be a company, institution or individual. The permittee is ultimately responsible for permit and EMC compliance. The permission/s on your permit can be suspended or revoked if you fail to comply with a permit condition, fail to pay any EMC charge due, or if it is necessary to do so to protect the environment or the Marine Park's living resources.

Marine Parks permits extend to all employees of the permittee, or other persons acting on behalf of, or at the direction of, the permittee for the purposes specified in the permit. In addition, the permit may contain conditions allowing the permittee to grant an authority that allows other people to conduct operations under the permit, not necessarily on behalf of the permittee. The permittee remains responsible for any actions undertaken by those they authorise, including compliance with permit conditions and fulfilling EMC obligations.

Know where you can go and what you can and should do

The activities you may conduct and the general areas you can access are identified on the first page of your permit. Specific requirements for individual locations may be described in the permit conditions.

Along with the Regulations, Zoning Plan and plans of management, your permit conditions be the 'rold rules' for your use of the Marine Parks, and may include conditions on:

- exclusion areas
- the way you conduct activities
- booking requirements prior to accessing specific areas within the darine Pale
- the number of times you may access an area
- maintenance requirements for moorings and structures
- your duty to notify authorities in the event of an incident that ay cause harm to the environment (oil spill or emergency advice hotline 07 3830 4919)
- your duty to notify us in the event of any death, injury, loss of damage (email permitscompliance@gbrmpa.gov.au).

We recommend that you and your staff regularly recommendation permit is changed or continued.

Changing or continuing your mit

If you wish to change aspects of your perclit, an application must be lodged with GBRMPA or QPWS, clearly stating the desired changes. Some common changes are:

- adding or changing a vess
- increasing the number of passengers
- changing me types of acavities undertaken.
- adding or tanging ocations.

In most cases, an assessment or administrative fee will be charged. A schedule of fees is available on GBRMPA's website at www.gbrmpa.gov.au.

Before your existing permit expires, a new permit application must be made. This application is assessed by GBRMPA and QPWS in the same way as an initial application. Operators can continue to operate in accordance with their existing permit if their new application was lodged with GBRMPA or QPWS prior to their existing permit's expiry date. This remains the case until the application is granted, refused, withdrawn or lapses.

Permit application assessment fees apply. Please refer to our schedule of fees.

In most cases, GBRMPA will send you a reminder letter when your current permit is about to expire. However, the onus is on you to lodge an application to continue your permit. Not receiving a reminder notice is not accepted as a reason for conducting an unpermitted operation, and you will have to cease operations immediately if you do not apply to continue your permit in time.

2 Completing your post-permit requirements

2.1 Deed of agreement, bond and insurance

Most standard tourism permits do not require a deed of agreement. Permits that contain a structure/facility, or are classified as medium to high risk, may contain a condition requiring the permittee to enter into a deed of agreement between the permittee, GBRMPA and sometimes QPWS. This deed binds the permittee to certain obligations, such as:

- indemnifying GBRMPA or QPWS
- maintaining adequate insurance
- ensuring removal of structures and clean-up of the site of operations, if directed
- in some cases the payment of a bond.

The deed must be entered into and returned to GBRMPA within the timeframe specified in your permit.

If your deed includes a requirement to lodge a bond with GBRMPA, the bond amount will be specified in the deed and should be in the form of a cash bond or bank guarantee. The bond must be lodged with GBRMPA within the timeframe specified in the deed.

The deed of agreement or permit conditions also contain insurance requirements, however you should not rely upon GBRMPA's insurance requirements under the deed to indicate what is sufficient incurance for your operation. This is a minimum requirement, and you should seek independent insurance advice on the level and type of cover appropriate for your specific operation and its associated activities.

2.2 Making use of your permit

Commencing operations

The Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 1983 requires the per vicee to commence operations under a permit within 120 days of the commencement date of the permit bowever, GBRMPA's policy, Managing tourism permissions to operate in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, requires permittees to start operations under their tourism permits within the first two years of the start date of the permit or your permit may be revoked. This applies to each tourism permit you are granted, even if it is a continuation of an existing permit.

Please note some permit conditions (for example, instantion of a mooring) may have other timeframes for commencing.

Reasonable use

Some Marine Parks tourism per sits are 'special tourism permissions' because they allow you to conduct a tourism activity that has been capped or limited by the Regulations or a plan of management. You will retain first option on your special tourism permission, relating you have made reasonable use of that permission (and ensured that you applied for your next promit before your current one expires). For current special tourism permissions, reasonable use is deemed to be an average of 50 days use per year for each vessel or aircraft that is endorsed to undertake capped activities. The number of passengers carried will not be reviewed.

If you hold a'special tourism permission', GBRMPA will check whether you have undertaken reasonable use when you apply for your next permit. The agency will make a separate decision about each endorsed vessel or aircraft. Use of ancillary vessels, such as glass-bottom boats, semi-submersibles and dive tenders, will not be reviewed.

Use of your 'special tourism permission' will be reviewed over the entire term of the permit, except if your permit has been transferred, in which case you may request that only use since the transfer be reviewed.

2.3 Environmental site supervision

As part of the permit process you may incur site supervision fees for cost recovery purposes if environmental site supervisors are required to supervise or inspect your works or audit your activities. Site supervision is an essential component of managing projects that have the capacity to have impacts on the Marine Parks and its users. GBRMPA will inform the applicant at least 48 hours beforehand if costs are to be recovered.

As a guide, site supervision costs may consist of:

- airfares, accommodation and transport to and from the site to be inspected (for example, by boat, helicopter etc). Where possible the cheapest fares and base accommodation with be sought, subject to availability.
- salary costs and travel allowance for the environmental site supervisor(s) supervising and inspecting your activity. Information about the daily rate for environmental site supervisors may be obtained by contacting GBRMPA.

2.4 Structure maintenance requirements

Vessel/aircraft moorings

GBRMPA and QPWS manage moorings in the Marine Parks consistent with the *Policy on moorings in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park*. A mooring permittee is required to have permitted moorings inspected annually by an 'appropriately qualified person' to ensure moorings are maintained to design specifications. GBRMPA, in consultation with QPWS and the Association of Marine Park Tourism Operators, has approved a definition for 'appropriately qualified person'. Facilities/structures (such as jetties, tourist pontoons, marinas, pipelines)

GBRMPA and QPWS manage facilities in the Marine Parks consistent with the *Structures olicy*. Permittees are required to provide an annual maintenance compliance certificate, duly certified by a Registeres Professional Engineer of Queensland, that verifies the structures have been installed and maintaineetin accordance with the approved drawings, and are fit for purpose.

3 About the environmental management charge (EMC)

3.1 What is the EMC?

The EMC is a charge associated with some commercial activities, including tourism operations, non-tourist charter operations and facilities, operated under a permit granted by GBRMPA.

For most tourism operations, visitors to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park participating in a tourist activity are liable to pay the charge to the permittee, who then remits the charge to the agency.

For other operations in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, such as those involving the hire of equipment, installation and operation of tourist facilities, underwater observatories, sewage outfalls and vending operations, the permittee must pay fixed quarterly charges to GBRMPA.

3.2 How is the EMC used?

The funds collected through the EMC are vital to protecting and managing the Great Barrier and Marine Park, one of the largest and best known World Heritage Areas. All funds received as EMC payments are applied directly to management of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, including education and research, a mpliance patrols, site planning, public moorings, reef protection markers, information signs and maps.

3.3 What are your obligations?

The role of the permittee is to collect the appropriate EMC and remit the harge to GBRMPA by the due date, in accordance with Part 8 of the Regulations.

As a permittee, you are responsible for:

- collecting the correct amount of the EMC from adividual visits for tourist related operations and from non-tourist charter passengers
- keeping accurate and up-to-date record of the EM
- for most operations, submitting the ENC retainmenterly by the due date, even where there is no activity
- remitting all payments quarterly the ductate
- accurately advertising the EM

Please note that regardless of area by incos arrangements you may make, as the permittee you have the responsibility to ensure compliance with the conditions of your permit and to ensure the full and timely lodgement of all EMC returns all payments.

3.4 Does the GSTapply?

You are not recaired to y GST on any EMC payments.

4 Collecting the EMC

4.1 Who must pay?

Visitors in a tourist program

Most commonly, it is Great Barrier Reef Marine Park visitors participating in a tourist activity who must pay the EMC. This charge is collected by the permittee and remitted to GBRMPA on a quarterly basis.

The term 'visitor' is defined in the Regulations as meaning:

- a tourist
- any other person who is provided with a service in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park under a tourist program.

In calculating the amount of EMC due and owing, you are required by the Regulations to count visitors as defined above. See Section 4.2 for exemptions.

Staff or crew who are on duty should not be counted as visitors. However, if they are off day and taking part in your tourist program, they are considered to be visitors and must be included.

EMC must be collected for visitors travelling on discounted fares, including children and prisioners.

Non-tourist charter passengers

EMC must be collected from passengers on non-tourist vessel charters, such as researchers, and remitted to the agency on a quarterly basis.

Permittees who provide services, structures and fittle

Permittees must pay fixed quarterly charges for the operations list and low.

- beach hire
- underwater observatory
- land-based sewage outfall discharge
- vending
- mariculture
- pontoon
- marina.

4.2 Are there exemptions?

EMC should **not** be collected a majoritors who are carried free-of-charge (FOC) and are:

- children leman for years old
- beneficiaries stered charities
- supervised school groups
- participating in tourism industry trade familiarisations
- media crews reporting on Great Barrier Reef Marine Park issues.

EMC should **not** be collected from:

- visitors who have already paid the full EMC for that day to another operator
- visitors who are on their fourth and subsequent days of an extended trip with one operator, providing the visitor has paid the maximum charge (\$18.00 (1 January to 31 March) or \$19.50 (1 April to 31 December))
- transfer passengers who transit the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park via the most direct route and for whom the permittee does not provide any tourism activities for two hours after disembarkation
- passengers who visit the Queensland Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park ONLY.

You are required to keep records of any exemptions for at least two years.

4.3 How much is the EMC?

To understand exactly how much EMC you need to collect and pay, please carefully check the fee schedule.

This is a summary of the relevant provisions of Part VA of the Marine Park Act and Part 8 of the Regulations. Any person affected by the EMC should consult the Marine Park Act and Regulations and/or seek advice in relation to their liability.

EMC fee schedule 2016

Tourist related visitors - daily charges

Full-day visitors

Permittee to collect from each visitor **\$6 per day** (1 January to 31 March) or **\$6.50 per day** (1 April to 31 December) for:

- trips of three hours or more
- trips entering the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park before 5.00 pm
- trips leaving the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park after 6.00 am
- first three days of an extended charter
- any visitors who are on the fourth or subsequent days of an extended charter with a different operator and who then participates in your tourist operation.

Part-day visitors

Permittee to collect from each visitor \$3 (1 January Mach) 0 33. 25 (1 April to 31 December) for:

- trips less than three hours
- the first or only day of a trip entering the Great Barrie Reef Marine Park after 5.00 pm
- the last or only day of a trip leaving the G Lat Barrier Reef Marine Park before 6.00 am.

Semi-submersible and glass-bottomed bat excursions

A trip to conduct a coral viewing program provides for a stand-alone activity involving an excursion for visitors to view marine life from a see i-submersible or glass-bottomed boat. Please note that this does not include glass-bottomed and sem-submersible excursions which are ancillary to another tourist program.

Permittee to collect from eact visitor 40 cents per excursion.

If a visitor particulates in more than one excursion on the same day and all the excursions are provided under the same provided only pays for the first excursion.

Sight-se ing rights

Permittee to collectrom each visitor 40 cents per excursion.

If a visitor participates in more than one excursion on the same day and all the excursions are provided under the same permit, the visitor only pays for the first excursion.

Tourist related services and structures – fixed quarterly charges

Beach hire

Charges are based on the equipment listed on the permit and the permittee must pay the EMC even when there was **no activity**.

Non-motorised beach hire

- fewer than six pieces of equipment: \$12 per quarter
- six or more pieces of equipment: \$25 per quarter.

Dinghy hire

A dinghy is a small open boat having no designed sleeping accommodation. It does not include half-cabin boats.

- fewer than six dinghies: **\$50 per quarter**
- six or more dinghies: \$12 per dinghy per quarter.

Motorised water sports

- if the equipment is jet boats* designed to carry no more than two persons: \$25 per quarter
- if the equipment includes no jet boats: \$62 per quarter
- if the equipment is jet boats* and other motorised equipment: \$87 per quarter
- if the equipment is jet boats* designed to carry no more than two persons **and** jet boats* designed to carry more than two persons: **\$25 plus \$87 per quarter**.
- *Jet boats includes jet skis or jet boards

Installations and tourist facilities

Pontoons

Pontoons include tourist, helicopter and swim pontoons.

- an area less than or equal to 40 square metres: \$90 per quarter
- an area greater than 40 square metres: \$180 per quarter.

Floating hotels

• \$280 per quarter.

Underwater observatories (other than those attacked to ponto

• \$130 per quarter.

Non-tourist charter passengers

This category applies to commercial vessels available for charter operations to conduct non-tourist activities (for example, surveys, research, commercial filmpraking and delivery of goods/crew). Passengers only pay on the first day of each trip. For extended trips assert ers only pay on the first day and all other days are recorded under free-of-charge.

\$2 per person per trip.

Non-tourist related ervice and structures – fixed quarterly charges

Vending

The general mode of peration of such vessels is for the sale of goods or services from a vessel. No visitors are carried.

• \$30 per metre of the length of the vessel per quarter.

Marina

• \$380 per quarter (for construction or operation).

Mariculture

• \$500 per quarter for the first 10 hectares plus \$200 per quarter for each additional 10 hectares.

The charge applies to the establishment or operation of farming facilities for the culture of pearls and clams.

Land-based sewage outfall discharge

This charge applies to marine outfalls only.

- Sewage is taken to have received tertiary treatment if the effluent complies with standards described in the Point Source Sewage Discharge return. If sewage has received tertiary treatment, the charge is **\$400 per quarter**.
- If sewage has not received tertiary treatment the charge is \$400 per quarter, plus a charge based on a cost per unit nutrient formula: \$4 x V x (N + P).

Where: **V** is the total volume of sewage discharged to the Marine Park in the quarter, expressed as megalitres.

N is the average concentration of total nitrogen, expressed as milligrams per litre.

P is the average concentration of total phosphorous, expressed as milligrams per litre.

For further information regarding the requirements for tertiary, secondary and primary treatment, please refer to the Regulations.

4.4 Information for your customers

Advertising

As a Great Barrier Reef Marine Park permittee, your obligation to belief the Morrom visitors includes correctly representing the amount of the EMC when advertising your tox price.

It is your responsibility to ensure consistency across all media including wassites, brochures, television advertising, tax invoices and receipts.

Where additional fees and charges are advertised out just ensure that a consumer can readily identify the correct EMC component.

Examples of correct EMC advertising include

- total price \$.... including the wich mental management charge, or alternately
- total price \$.... including the environmental management charge of \$6.50.

NB. \$6.50 after 1 April 2016

You need to be aware that it is a crininal offence under the Marine Park Act to make a false or misleading representation of the EMC.

You should refer to the *Trace Prectices Amendment (Clarity in Pricing) Act 2008* for other requirements of price advertising.

Educating your visitors

When collecting the EMC from your visitors you are encouraged to inform them about the EMC, how much they are required to pay and what the money is used for.

By paying the EMC, your visitors are helping to protect, conserve and ensure the ecologically sustainable use of this unique and amazing coral reef environment.

You can help them understand the positive contribution they are making to the sustainable future of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park and the World Heritage Area.

To make it easier to explain the EMC to your passengers, its role in management, and how much each visitor pays, please visit www.gbrmpa.gov.au.

5 Completing your logbooks

You may submit your EMC data via EMC Online, which is the preferred way to complete your quarterly returns. To set up a user account, please contact emc@gbrmpa.gov.au or (07) 4750 0700.

Alternatively, information can be submitted by electronic logbooks (excel spreadsheet for vessel, bareboat and aircraft operators). The information you collect includes the number of visitors carried, the amount of EMC payable and all the reefs, islands, and bays visited.

You must complete a separate logbook for each operation permitted.

Please take care to complete the logbook accurately, paying particular attention to:

- providing correct information about the permit you are operating under
- ensuring information for each operation on a permit is recorded, even if there was no activity
- providing correct details of the locations you visited. Appendix A of this guide contains a comprehensive list of locations within the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park. Further information on locations can be found at www.gbrmpa.gov.au.

5.1 How do I provide the required information?

EMC Online

EMC Online is an easy-to-use system which allows operators to submit EMC from tion or pay the required amount straight away.

Key features that reduce business processing times include:

- Favourites you can establish favourites to accommodate and reduce data entry time.
- Reports you can create customised reports which can be use of track the number of visitors you take into the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park.
- Payment gateway you can pay EMC through secure or eway.
- Submitting nil returns for future quarters you be submit nil returns for up to a year in advance.

Electronic logbooks

If you are not registered with EMC Online, the gency provides you with EMC logbooks when your permit is granted and at the beginning of each calendaryea. This is summary of logbook information on the amount of EMC due.

5.2 What happens it did not operate?

Log books must be submitted for operations even if you did not operate during the relevant quarter. When you did not operate during a quarter, nil a tivity hust be submitted for each operation for which there was no activity. EMC Online provides you with the ability to submit nil activity several quarters in advance.

If you did not operate because you have hired your vessel to another permittee who is conducting their own tourist program under their own permit, you should submit nil activity. The other permittee is required to collect any EMC and submit their own returns.

5.3 Other quarterly charges

For the operations listed below, you are not required to keep daily logbooks but you **must** pay a fixed quarterly charge.



* If you have a beach hire permission you must pay the EMC even when there was no activity and the EMC rate is based on the number and type of permitted equipment on your permit. You may also choose to make a single annual payment of the total amount owed for the year instead of four individual submissions, for example \$100 at the end of the first quarter (30 April) instead of \$25.00 each quarter.

6 How to submit EMC data and payment

6.1 Due dates

EMC data and payment (where applicable) must be submitted quarterly to GBRMPA. At the end of each quarter, you have the next month to collate your data and where applicable submit your payment. To allow easy processing of payments, a payment gateway is incorporated into EMC Online.

The due dates are:

6.2 Payment options

7 Permit compliance and penalties

You are legally required to comply with all your permit conditions. This includes providing a signed deed of agreement, bond, insurance or maintenance certificate, within the timeframes specified by your permit conditions.

Permittees who fail to meet obligations under their permit may face financial penalties or administrative compliance actions, including having their permit suspended and ultimately revoked. Failure to comply with state legislation may incur additional compliance actions.

Copies of the relevant legislation are available at www.gbrmpa.gov.au.

7.1 Permit suspension and revocation

Permits and permission(s) may be suspended if it is necessary to do so to protect the environment, or if GBRMPA has reason to believe that the permittee has contravened, or is likely to contravene, the permit conditions, subject to an investigation.

It is illegal for you to operate in the Marine Parks while suspended.

You will be required to resolve all obligations to end the suspension.

Permits and permissions may be revoked within 10 business days after the agency completes its investigation, meaning you no longer have permission to operate in the Marine Parks.

7.2 Financial penalties

In addition to administrative compliance actions such as suspending and revoking permits and permissions, permittees that do not comply with their permit conditions may incur financial denaltic through the courts or be issued with a penalty infringement notice by Marine Parks inspectors. The most column offences may incur the following penalties:

- Conduct contravening condition of permission or authority (refer to the Marine Park Act section 38EA(1)) Maximum penalty \$150,00 for a gravated offence and \$90,000 in any other case.
- Conduct contravening a condition of permission or authority civil penalty provision (refer to the Marine Park Act section 38EB): Maximus, penalty \$360,000 for an aggravated contravention by an individual, \$180,000 for an including in any other case, \$3,600,000 for an aggravated contravention by a corporation and \$1,800,000 for a proportion in any other case.
- Requirement to produce a termission for inspection (refer to the Regulations 88ZW) Maximum penalty \$9,000.
- Contravening order r direction (refer to the Marine Park Act section 38DC) Maximum penalty \$90,000.

7.3 Infringement notices

Breaches of pelloits can a tract an infringement notice. However, you may elect to have the matter dealt with by the court.

Infringement notices may be issued for (refer to the Regulations subregulation 189):

- contravening condition of permission \$720
- operating without required permission \$2160
- not producing a copy of your permit when requested by an inspector \$180
- not displaying mooring reference number on mooring buoy \$540

Penalty amounts are current at the date of printing, however these may change

8 EMC compliance and penalties

You are legally required to meet all your EMC obligations, such as maintaining appropriate records and providing information and payments, by the due dates. Permittees who fail to meet their EMC obligations may face financial penalties or may have their permit suspended and ultimately revoked.

Copies of the relevant legislation are available at www.gbrmpa.gov.au.

8.1 EMC timelines

Permittees are allowed one month after the end of the quarter to collate data and submit it to GBRMPA, along with the required remitted charges.

The final date for submitting EMC data and payment is the last day of the month after the end of the quarter. To avoid a \$250 penalty, permittees should meet their EMC obligations prior to this date.

EMC data and payments received after the due date immediately incur a late payment penalty (as outlined in 8.2). Failure to meet EMC obligations may lead to your permissions being suspended and subsequently worked.

If payment of EMC is not successful (for example, a cheque is dishonoured on presentation), a credit provider declines to authorise the payment), payment is taken not to have been made until:

- the payment by cheque is honoured on presentation; or
- the payment is successfully made in another way (as outlined in 6.24)

Where payments are made and not honoured (that is, cheques), crimical or via actical may result.

8.2 Late payment penalty

If you fail to pay the EMC by the due date you will be liable to pay the payment penalty.

The late payment penalty is calculated as the greater 17 ther \$250, 20 per cent per annum of the amount owing, calculated from the due date.

8.3 Permission suspension and evocation

Permissions may be suspended if the permittee fail to comply with the Regulations requiring the provision of EMC information and remittance of apply sable payments.

It is illegal for you to operate the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park under suspended permissions.

If the permissions you have an your permit have been suspended because you failed to meet your EMC obligations, you will be required to assolve all of light one and pay a **reinstatement fee of \$120** per permission to end the suspension.

Permissions may be worked 0 business days after a permission is suspended if the outstanding EMC requirements have not been met. This would mean you no longer have permission to operate in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park.

It is illegal for you to operate in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park under revoked permissions.

8.4 Court-imposed penalties

If you fail to meet other relevant legal requirements, the court may impose the following penalties:

- Failure to give information or returns (refer to the Marine Park Act section 39Q) Maximum penalty \$7200 for an individual.
- Failure to pay collected amount on time (refer to the Marine Park Act section 39FB)

 Maximum penalty \$1800 per day for an individual and \$9000 per day for a corporation up to a maximum of 20 days. The maximum penalty that can be imposed is \$36,000 for an individual and \$180,000 for a corporation (in addition to a penalty amount equal to the amount of the charge payable and the associated late payment penalty).

- Failure to collect a charge from a visitor (refer to the Marine Park Act section 39FA)
 - Maximum penalty \$9000 for an individual and \$45,000 for a corporation (in addition to a penalty amount equal to the amount of the charge and a late payment penalty).
- Not keeping proper records (refer to the Regulations subregulation 166)
 - Maximum penalty \$9000 for an individual and \$45,000 for a corporation.
- Altering records to claim exemption (refer to the Regulations subregulation 144)

 Maximum penalty \$9000 for an individual and \$45,000 for a corporation.
- Not retaining records for two years (refer to the Regulations subregulation 166(4))

 Maximum penalty \$9000 for an individual and \$45,000 for a corporation.
- Not recording information in the logbook supplied or in a form approved by GBRMPA (refer to the Regulations subregulation 167)

Maximum penalty \$9000 for an individual and \$45,000 for a corporation.

Penalty amounts are current at the date of printing, however these may change.

8.5 Infringement notices

Breaches of record-keeping requirements may result in an infringement notice. However, you may elect to have the matter dealt with by the court.

Infringement notices may be issued for (refer to the Regulations subregulation 185):

- not keeping proper records: penalty \$900
- altering records to claim exemption: penalty \$1260
- not retaining records for two years: penalty \$900
- not recording information in the electronic logbook suppled or interform approved by the agency: penalty \$900.

Penalty amounts are current at the date of printing however these may change.

8.6 Audits

The agency will be conducting random and targeted addits in 2016 to ensure permittees are complying with their legislated obligations on advertising recording, collecting and remitting the EMC.





Environmental management charge privacy notice

Personal information provided by you on your environmental management charge (EMC) electronic logbooks is collected by the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority and protected by the *Privacy Act 1988*. The *Privacy Act 1988* provides for 13 Australian Privacy Principles that regulate how we must handle your information.

Why we collect your personal information

The Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975 requires the agency to assess and collect charges imposed by the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park (Environmental Management Charge – General) Act 1993 and the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park (Environmental Management Charge – Excise) Act 1993.

The information you provide on the EMC logbooks will be used to assess your liability to pay an EMC. It is a requirement under the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 1983 (the Regulations) for holders of chargeable permissions to give copies of the EMC logbook entries at quarterly intervals to the agency (see regulation 167 of the Regulations).

Failure to provide EMC logbook entries to us may result in a penalty of 40 penalty units (corrent) \$7200); see section 39Q of the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975*.

If you apply to us for a relevant permission, the information you provide on your FuC logboo extries may also be used to assess your application, by enabling the agency to determine whether you have out tanding EMC payments (see regulation 88R of the Regulations). We may also use this information to determine whether to suspend any relevant permission (see regulation 88ZT of the Regulations).

If we are unable to collect personal information on your EMC logbooks, we will be unable to assess your liability to pay EMC. You may also be subject to a penalty for failing to comply with the Act and Regulations.

Who we give your personal information to

We do not disclose personal information collected on the log bok entries to any third party or overseas entity.
