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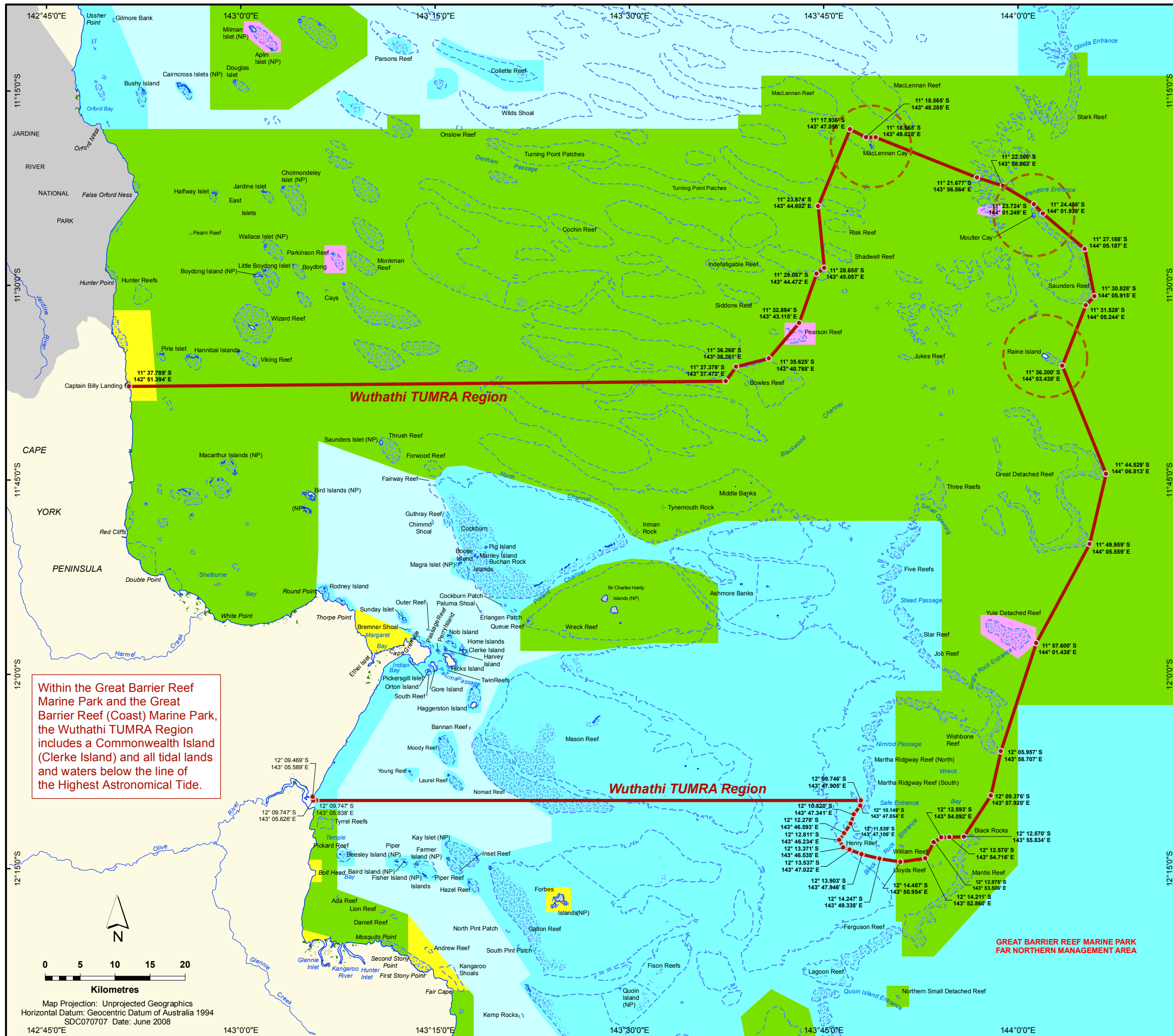
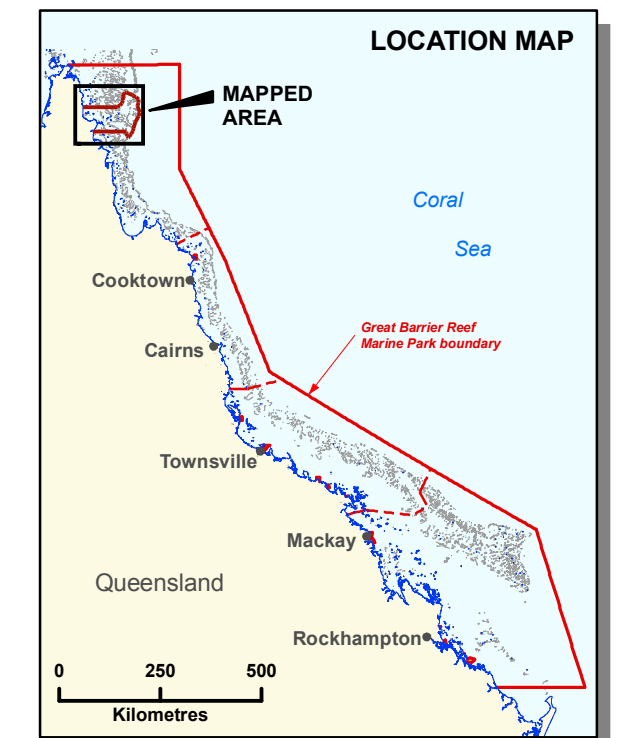

*The State of Queensland (represented by the Environmental Protection Agency) has negotiated this Indigenous Land Use Agreement (Area Agreement) with the Wuthathi People and Erubam Le, Meriam Le and Ugarem Le, concerning the proposed Raine Island National Park (Scientific) and surrounding waters extending 3 nautical miles from the high water mark of Raine Island, MacLennan Cay and Moulter Cay ("the ILUA").



Within the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park and the Great Barrier Reef (Coast) Marine Park, the Wuthathi TUMRA Region includes a Commonwealth Island (Clerke Island) and all tidal lands and waters below the line of the Highest Astronomical Tide.
