CONDITIONS OF THIS PERMIT

CONDITIONS FOR ALL PERMISSIONS

- G1 Unless otherwise indicated in this permit, the Permit Holder must:
 - (i) not use or enter the Marine Parks in a manner that is inconsistent with the provisions contained in Part 1 of a Plan of Management;
 - (ii) not contravene a provision contained in Part 2 of a Plan of Management; and
 - (iii) only access an intertidal area adjacent to a Planning Area location in a manner consistent with that provided in a Plan of Management for the Planning Area location itself.
- G2 The Permit Holder must:
 - (i) not use or enter the Restricted Access Special Management Areas at any time, other than in accordance with condition B2 or C5;
 - (ii) not use or enter the Maritime Cultural Heritage Special Management Areas except for the purpose of transiting, other than in accordance with condition B2 or C5; and
 - (iii) only use or enter Special Management Areas in accordance with the restrictions specified in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019 (Cth) and the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 (Cth).
- G3 Upon request by the Managing Agency, the Permit Holder must produce, within the time specified in the request, any document or information:
 - (i) in relation to the activities covered by this permit; or
 - (ii) otherwise required by a law or by some other enforceable obligation.

For the purposes of this condition, any document or information includes, but is not limited to, reports, certificates, approvals, data and copies of documents.

AUTHORITY CONDITIONS

- G4 The Permit Holder may authorise other persons to conduct the activities covered by this permit, by giving to those persons an Authority in the form attached to this permit (Attachment A) or in some other form approved by the Managing Agency.
- An Authority remains valid for the period of time shown on it, unless the Authority is sooner revoked in writing by the Permit Holder or unless the permission(s) to which the Authority applies is sooner suspended, revoked or expires.
- G6 The Permit Holder must provide a copy of this permit to any person given an Authority under condition G4.

DEED CONDITIONS

- G7 The Permit Holder and either or both of the Managing Agencies (whichever is applicable) must enter into the Permit Deed attached to this permit within 30 business days of the commencement date of this permit.
- G8 The Permit Holder must observe and perform its obligations pursuant to the Permit Deed required under condition G7. Any breach of the terms of the Permit Deed shall be a breach of this condition.

INCIDENT REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- G9 On becoming aware of an incident the Permit Holder must notify the Managing Agency without delay. The notification must include:
 - (i) details of the incident including date, time, place, cause and nature of the incident;
 - (ii) the name and contact details of the person(s) witnessing, reporting and/or responsible for the incident;
 - (iii) the type, estimated volume and concentration of any pollutants involved;
 - (iv) the type and number of any pests involved;
 - (v) the type and estimated scale of any physical damage to the environment that has occurred and/or may occur; and
 - (vi) measures taken or proposed to be taken to mitigate physical damage to the environment and the success and/or likelihood of success of those measures.

- G10 If requested by the Managing Agency, a written incident report must be provided to the Managing Agency within 24 hours of the request. This written incident report must include the details specified in condition G9 as well as the following additional details:
 - (i) measures taken or proposed to prevent or mitigate against the recurrence of such an incident; and
 - (ii) any other relevant matters determined by the Permit Holder or as directed by the Managing Agency.

VESSELS AND SHIPS

- G11 The Permit Holder must only operate vessels less than 50 metres in overall length unless operating in accordance with condition B4.
- G12 Prior to operating any vessel or ship under this permit, the Permit Holder must:
 - (i) give written notification to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority of the vessel or ship name and registration number of the specific vessel or ship to be operated under this permit; and
 - (ii) obtain written approval for use of that vessel or ship from the Managing Agency.
- G13 A copy of the written approval given by the Managing Agency under condition G12(ii) must be held onboard the vessel or ship at all times.
- G14 An approval under condition G12(ii) above ceases to have effect for a specific vessel or ship when a subsequent approval for the same or any other vessel or ship is given under that condition.

PERMITTED ACTIVITIES

G15 The Permit Holder may only conduct the following barge activities, for the purposes for which permission(s) has been granted under this permit, in accordance with the conditions of this permit:

BEACH LANDINGS

- When undertaking beach landings without an Intertidal Areas Notification Approval, the Permit Holder must only access intertidal areas using a vessel access facility that is of a type and design suitable for the vessel.
- G17 If access to other intertidal areas is required when undertaking beach landings using a vessel greater than 12 metres in overall length, the Permit Holder must:
 - (i) only access the intertidal areas listed in an Intertidal Areas Notification Approval provided by the Managing Agency to the Permit Holder with this permit, or provided by the Managing Agency to the Permit Holder in response to a written notice given in accordance with condition G17(ii);
 - (ii) provide the Managing Agency with at least 14 days written notice if the Permit Holder requests access to any intertidal areas not already listed in an Intertidal Areas Notification Approval provided to the Permit Holder under condition G17(i);
 - (iii) comply with any direction provided by the Managing Agency to the Permit Holder relating to access to intertidal areas; and
 - (iv) keep a copy of all Intertidal Areas Notification Approvals provided to the Permit Holder under condition G17(i) with this permit.

BARGE OPERATION CONDITIONS

- B1 The Permit Holder must ensure that vessel or ship propellers are disengaged during cargo transfer unless it is unsafe to do so.
- B2 A minimum of 14 days prior to accessing any Restricted Access Special Management Area, the Permit Holder must:
 - (i) obtain written approval from the Managing Agency; and
 - (ii) comply with any directions given by the Managing Agency in relation to such access.

ACCESS FOR OBSERVERS

- B3 The Permit Holder must provide the Managing Agency with:
 - (i) access to activities authorised under this permit to witness, inspect or audit any part of the operations;
 - (ii) access to any documented records related to activities authorised under this permit; and
 - (iii) the necessary assistance in carrying out their duties.

TUG AND TOW

- B4 When vessels are in a tug-and-tow configuration and the total length of the tow is greater than 150 metres, from the stern of the towing vessel to the aft end of the tow, the Permit Holder must ensure that the vessels are:
 - (i) each less than 50 metres in overall length;
 - (ii) only operated within the Designated Shipping Area or General Use Zone unless transiting to and from an approved intertidal area in accordance with conditions G16 and G17;
 - (iii) not anchored outside the Designated Shipping Area or General Use Zone at any time unless within a Designated Anchorage; and
 - (iv) manned by a suitably qualified pilot within the Compulsory Pilotage Area unless an exemption has otherwise been granted.

CHARTER OPERATION CONDITIONS

WITHOUT NOTIFICATION

- C1 When conducting charter operations, the Permit Holder may provide transport and related services to persons other than tourists, without prior notification to the Managing Agency, except as specified under condition C5.
- C2 The Permit Holder must not conduct charter operations whilst transporting tourists or in conjunction with a tourist program.
- When providing transport and services to persons conducting activities in the Marine Parks which require the written permission of the Managing Agency, the Permit Holder must:
 - (i) not operate under this permit unless those persons have been granted the appropriate Marine Parks permit; and
 - (ii) only conduct operations in accordance with the conditions of that permit.

WITH NOTIFICATION

- C4 When providing transport and services to persons conducting activities in the Marine Parks which require notification to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority under Part 5 of the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003* (Cth) and/or Part 4 of the *Marine Parks (Great Barrier Reef Coast) Zoning Plan 2004* (Qld), the Permit Holder must:
 - (i) not operate under this permit unless those persons have notified the relevant Managing Agency of their intended activities; and
 - (ii) conduct operations in accordance with any directions imposed by the Managing Agency.
- When conducting transport and related services to persons other than tourists, the Permit Holder must not access Preservation Zones and Restricted Access Special Management Areas in accordance with condition G1 unless:
 - (i) in the presence of an officer of the Managing Agency; or
 - (ii) with prior written approval of the Managing Agency.

INTERPRETATION AND DICTIONARY

INTERPRETATION

This permit extends to all employees of the Permit Holder, and other persons acting on behalf of or at the direction of the Permit Holder, for the purposes specified in this permit.

This permit is not intended to extinguish any native title.

Terms which are defined in the Dictionary have the meanings respectively ascribed to them.

A reference to any legislation or legislative provision:

- (a) is a reference to that legislation or legislative provision as in force from time to time; and
- includes any statutory modification, substitution or re-enactment of that legislation or legislative provision.

A reference to anything after the words "include" or "including" does not limit what else might be included.

A note or heading may be used to give assistance in interpreting conditions in case of ambiguity.

A reference to a date includes that date.

DICTIONARY

'Affected Persons' means the Permit Holder and other persons who are acting on behalf of, or with the approval or at the direction of, the Permit Holder or for whom the Permit Holder is otherwise legally responsible.

'aircraft' has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine</u> Park Act 1975 (Cth).

'Amalgamated Great Barrier Reef Section' has the same meaning as the 'Great Barrier Reef Marine Park – Amalgamated Great Barrier Reef Section' in the <u>Great Barrier Reef (Declaration of Amalgamated Marine Park Area) Proclamation 2004 (Cth).</u>

'ancillary vessel' means a small vessel which:

- (a) is not the primary vessel of the operation;
- (b) is only operated to provide services to the participants of the Permit Holder's operation; and
- (c) is only operated within three (3) nautical miles of the primary

'Australian Institute of Marine Science Restricted Access Special Management Area' has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier</u> Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019 (Cth).

'Authority' means an authority granted in accordance with conditions G4 to G6.

'barge' means a flat bottomed vessel designed to transport freight and goods over water either under its own power or when being pushed or towed; or for use as a stationary work platform in a marine environment

'bulk fuel' means any fuel carried in vessel cargo spaces and/or fuel carried in container(s) with a capacity greater than 3,000 litres and does not include the vessel's primary fuel tank.

'Cairns Area Plan of Management' means the <u>Cairns Area Plan of Management 1998</u> (Cth).

'Cairns Planning Area' has the same meaning as in the <u>Cairns Area</u> Plan of Management 1998 (Cth).

'Compulsory Pilotage Area' has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019 (Cth)</u>.

'Designated Anchorage' has the same meaning as in the <u>Great</u> Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019 (Cth).

'Designated Shipping Area' means:

- (a) the areas described in Part 10 of Schedule 1 of the <u>Great</u>

 <u>Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 (Cth)</u> (Attachment B); and
- (b) any other areas designated as a Shipping Area in the Marine Parks regulations.

'environment' has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier Reef</u> Marine Park Act 1975 (Cth).

'facility' has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine</u> <u>Park Act 1975 (Cth)</u>.

'General Use Zone':

- in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan</u> 2003 (Cth); and
- (b) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the <u>Marine Parks (Great Barrier Reef</u> <u>Coast) Zoning Plan 2004 (Qld)</u>.

'harm' has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine</u> <u>Park Act 1975 (Cth)</u>.

'Hinchinbrook Plan of Management' means the <u>Hinchinbrook Plan</u> of Management 2004 (Cth).

'Hinchinbrook Planning Area' has the same meaning as in the Hinchinbrook Plan of Management 2004 (Cth).

'incident' means an event within the knowledge of the Permit Holder involving actual or potential harm to the ecosystem in the Marine Parks, including but not limited to:

- (a) coral damage; or
- (b) cyclone damage; or
- (c) any shipping event that requires notification to a relevant authority under the <u>Transport Operations (Marine Safety) Act 1994 (Old)</u>, <u>Transport Operations (Marine Pollution) Act 1995 (Old)</u> or the <u>Navigation Act 2012 (Cth)</u>; or
- (d) any aircraft event that requires notification to the relevant Authority under the *Civil Aviation Act* 1988 (Cth); or
- (e) any discharge of untreated sewage effluent; or
- (f) any discharge of hazardous chemicals, fuel or biotoxic products.

'intertidal area' means that area of the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park between mean low water and the landward boundaries of the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park.

'MacLennan Cay Reef Restricted Access Special Management Area' has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine</u> Park Regulations 2019 (Cth).

'Managing Agency' means:

- (a) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority, a member of the staff of that Authority or a person referred to in Section 48A of the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975 (Cth)</u> performing functions or exercising powers under that Act in accordance with an agreement referred to in that section; and
- (b) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park, the Chief Executive of the Department of Environment and Science, his/her Delegate, an officer of the Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service, or a person referred to in section 52 of the <u>Marine Parks</u> <u>Act 2004 (Qld)</u>, appointed as an inspector.

'Marine Parks' means:

- the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park established by the <u>Great</u> <u>Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975 (Cth)</u>; and
- (b) The Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park established pursuant to the Marine Parks Act 2004 (Qld).

'Marine Parks regulations' means:

- (a) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019 (Cth)</u>; and
- (b) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park, the Marine Parks Regulation 2017 (Qld).

'Maritime Cultural Heritage Special Management Area' has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations</u> 2019 (Cth).

'Moulter Cay Reef Restricted Access Special Management Area' has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine Park</u> Regulations 2019 (Cth).

'One Tree Island Reef (23-055) Restricted Access Special Management Area' has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier</u> Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019 (Cth).

'overall length' has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975 (Cth)</u>.

'packaged fuel' means fuel that is carried in container(s) with a capacity less than 3,000 litres.

Note: Fuel carried in vessel cargo spaces, not including the vessel's primary fuel tank, is considered bulk fuel.

'permit' means the permission(s) the subject of Permit Number PERMIT NUMBER, and the associated conditions, granted to the Permit Holder pursuant to the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019 (Cth)</u> and the <u>Marine Parks Regulation 2017 (Qld)</u> as set out in this document.

'Permit Deed' means the deed attached to this permit and entered into pursuant to condition G7 of this permit.

'permitted activities' means the activities permitted by the conditions of this permit.

'permitted use' includes the activities contemplated by the permitted use

'person' includes a natural person, a body corporate, a company or an incorporated association.

'pest' means any animal, plant, parasite or disease causing organism (such as bacteria, virus or fungus) capable of causing adverse impacts to environmental, economic or social values whether or not it is:

- (a) contributing to a Listed Key Threatening Process under the <u>Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999</u>
 (Cth): or
- (b) prohibited or restricted under the Biosecurity Act 2014 (Qld).

'Planning Area' means:

- (a) the Cairns Planning Area;
- (b) the Hinchinbrook Planning Area; and
- (c) the Whitsunday Planning Area.

'Planning Area location' means an area defined as a Location in the Cairns Area Plan of Management, the Hinchinbrook Plan of Management or the Whitsundays Plan of Management

'Plan of Management' means a plan of management, as in force from time to time, that is prepared for the Marine Park in accordance with Part VB of the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975* (Cth).

'Preservation Zone':

- in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan</u> 2003 (Cth); and
- (b) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the <u>Marine Parks (Great Barrier Reef</u> <u>Coast) Zoning Plan 2004 (Qld)</u>.

'Raine Island Reef Restricted Access Special Management Area' has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019 (Cth).</u>

'Restricted Access Special Management Area' has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019</u> (Cth).

'ship' has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine</u> <u>Park Regulations 2019 (Cth).</u>

'Special Management Area' has the same meaning as in the <u>Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019 (Cth)</u>.




