CONDITIONS OF THIS PERMIT

CONDITIONS FOR ALL PERMISSIONS

- G1 Unless otherwise indicated in this permit, the Permit Holder must:
- (i) not use or enter the Marine Parks in a manner that is inconsistent with the provisions contained in Part 1 of a Plan of Management;
 - (ii) not contravene a provision contained in Part 2 of a Plan of Management; and
 - (iii) only access an intertidal area adjacent to a Planning Area location in a manner consistent with that provided in a Plan of Management for the Planning Area location itself.
- G2 The Permit Holder must:
- (i) not use or enter the Restricted Access Special Management Areas at any time, other than in accordance with condition G30;
 - (ii) not use or enter the Maritime Cultural Heritage Special Management Areas except for the purpose of transiting; and
 - (iii) only use or enter Special Management Areas in accordance with the restrictions specified in the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019* (Cth) and the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003* (Cth).
- G3 Upon request by the Managing Agency, the Permit Holder must produce, within the time specified in the request, any document or information:
- (i) in relation to the activities covered by this permit; or
 - (ii) otherwise required by a law or by some other enforceable obligation.
- For the purposes of this condition, any document or information includes, but is not limited to, reports, certificates, approvals, data and copies of documents.

AUTHORITY CONDITIONS

- G4 The Permit Holder may authorise other persons to conduct the activities covered by this permit, by giving to those persons an Authority in the form attached to this permit (Attachment A) or in some other form approved by the Managing Agency.
- G5 An Authority remains valid for the period of time shown on it, unless the Authority is sooner revoked in writing by the Permit Holder or unless the permission(s) to which the Authority applies is sooner suspended, revoked or expires.
- G6 The Permit Holder must provide a copy of this permit to any person given an Authority under condition G4

INDEMNITY

- G7 The Permit Holder releases the Managing Agency, to the full extent permitted by law, from and Indemnifies the Managing Agency against all Claims arising from the Managing Agency's issue and supervision of this permit and the Managing Agency's management of the Marine Parks except to the extent that a Claim is caused or contributed to by the negligence of the Managing Agency, its servants or agents.
- G8 To avoid doubt, the release referred to in condition G7 extends to Claims arising from the Managing Agency's exercise of its rights under this permit and under all applicable legislation and related documents.
- G9 In addition to the indemnity in condition G7, the Permit Holder Indemnifies the Managing Agency against all Claims arising from or related to:
- (i) the occupation and use of the Marine Parks by Affected Persons;
 - (ii) the conduct of, or participation, in the permitted use by Affected Persons;
 - (iii) the presence of an Affected Person in the Marine Parks in connection with this permit; and
 - (iv) a breach, by an Affected Person, of this permit,
- except to the extent that a Claim is caused or contributed to by the negligence of the Managing Agency, its servants or agents.
- G10 The Permit Holder must notify the Managing Agency in writing of any Claim Event immediately upon the Permit Holder becoming aware of the Claim Event.

NO WARRANTY AND RISK

- G11 The Managing Agency does not warrant that the Marine Parks are free from defect or that they are safe, fit, suitable or adequate for the permitted use. To the full extent permitted by law, all warranties as to fitness, suitability and adequacy implied by law are expressly excluded.
- G12 The Permit Holder uses the Marine Parks entirely at its own risk and is responsible for ensuring the area is suitable for the permitted use prior to commencing any permitted use.

INSURANCE

- G13 For the term of this permit, the Permit Holder must take out and maintain Appropriate Insurances.
- G14 From time to time the Managing Agency may by notice to the Permit Holder increase the minimum level of Appropriate Insurance cover if the Managing Agency reasonably believes such an increase is required.
- G15 The Permit Holder must ensure that the Appropriate Insurance policies are effected with an Appropriate Insurer.
- G16 The Permit Holder must ensure that Appropriate Insurance policies cover all invitees, employees, contractors, agents, members or clients of the Permit Holder and names the Managing Agency as an interested party.
- G17 In any circumstance where a policy for an Appropriate Insurance is cancelled, altered or expires before the expiry date of this permit, the Permit Holder must cease all activities in the Marine Parks until such time as an alternative Appropriate Insurance policy has been obtained.
- G18 The Permit Holder is deemed to have complied with condition G13, where the Permit Holder:
- (i) is a Commonwealth, State or Territory government department, agency or statutory body; and
 - (ii) is a self-insurer; and
 - (iii) has provided the Managing Agency with a certificate from an authorised officer of that department, agency or statutory body, to that effect.

INCIDENT REPORTING CONDITIONS

- G19 On becoming aware of an incident the Permit Holder must notify the Managing Agency without delay. The notification must include:
- (i) details of the incident including date, time, place, cause and nature of the incident;
 - (ii) the name and contact details of the person(s) witnessing, reporting and/or responsible for the incident;
 - (iii) the type, estimated volume and concentration of any pollutants involved;
 - (iv) the type and number of any pests involved;
 - (v) the type and estimated scale of any physical damage to the environment that has occurred and/or may occur; and
 - (vi) measures taken or proposed to be taken to mitigate physical damage to the environment and the success and/or likelihood of success of those measures.
- G20 If requested by the Managing Agency, a written incident report must be provided to the Managing Agency within 24 hours of the request. This written incident report must include the details specified in condition G19 as well as the following additional details:
- (i) measures taken or proposed to prevent or mitigate against the recurrence of such an incident; and
 - (ii) any other relevant matters determined by the Permit Holder or as directed by the Managing Agency.
- G21 On becoming aware that equipment installed under condition G24 is missing within the Marine Parks, the Permit Holder must advise the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority in writing without delay.

PROTECTED SPECIES REPORTING CONDITIONS

- G22 If a protected species is injured or killed in the course of the conduct of the permitted activities then the Permit Holder must notify the Managing Agency without delay of the injury or death, and ensure that:
- (i) all use of the equipment that may have contributed to the injury or death of the protected species ceases immediately;
 - (ii) an assessment is made of the cause of the injury or death;
 - (iii) review measures are implemented to minimise the risks identified; and
 - (iv) the permitted activities that resulted in the injury or death do not resume without the written approval of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority.

- G23 Within 72 hours of a protected species being injured or killed in the course of the conduct of the permitted activities, the Permit Holder must submit to permitscompliance@gbmpa.gov.au a completed Marine Wildlife Stranding and Mortality Report, using the template available on the Queensland Department of Environment and Science's website

EQUIPMENT

- G24 The Permit Holder may only use the following equipment for the purposes of conducting the program and only in accordance with condition G25:

non-fixed plankton nets ^{1,2}	short term use with no more than three (3) tows per site per day
non-fixed transect tapes or quadrats ^{1,4}	short-term use
light traps ^{2,4}	short-term use with no more than three (3) deployments per site per trip
stakes including star pickets ^{2,4}	long-term use and no more than 10 stakes at any one time
sub-surface and surface marker buoy ^{2,4}	long-term use and no more than 20 sub-surface and 10 surface marker buoys at any one time
Remotely Operated Vehicles including tethered or untethered surface and submarine units ²	short-term use and each Remotely Operated Vehicle must be no greater than 25kg including all equipment
Remotely Operated Vehicles including remotely piloted aircraft ²	short-term use and each Remotely Operated Vehicle must be no greater than 5kg including all equipment
Baited Remote Underwater Video Stations (BRUVs) ^{3,4}	short-term use with no more than five (5) stations at any one time baited with fresh or frozen, raw marine sourced products and/or manufactured marine fish food pellets within the expiry date

² must not be used in Buffer Zones, Marine National Park Zones and Commonwealth Islands Zones

³ must only be deployed within a Scientific Research Zone

⁴ must only be installed on bare reef rock and/or sand

- G25 The Permit Holder must ensure that all equipment used is:
- (i) clearly marked with the name of the Permit Holder and the permit number;
 - (ii) monitored and maintained at least every six (6) months if installed long-term; and
 - (iii) removed from the Marine Parks when no longer in use.

PERMITTED ACCESS

- G26 The Permit Holder must only conduct the program where a minimum of one (1) supervisor is present with every 10 program participants except as specified in condition G27(i).
- G27 When conducting the program at Lady Musgrave Reef (23-082a) and North West Island Reef (23-049), the Permit Holder must ensure:
- (i) a minimum of one (1) supervisor is present with every eight (8) program participants;
 - (ii) the total number of persons in the group, inclusive of program participants and supervisors, does not exceed 25 persons at Lady Musgrave Reef (23-082a); and
 - (iii) the total number of persons in the group, inclusive of program participants and supervisors, does not exceed 60 persons at North West Island Reef (23-049).
- G28 The Permit Holder must:
- (i) only access the intertidal areas listed in an Intertidal Area Notification Approval provided by the Managing Agency to the Permit Holder with this permit, or provided by the Managing Agency to the Permit Holder in response to a written notice given in accordance with condition G28(ii);
 - (ii) provide the Managing Agency with at least 14 days written notice if the Permit Holder requests access to any intertidal areas not already listed in an Intertidal Area Notification Approval provided to the Permit Holder under condition G28(i);
 - (iii) comply with any direction provided by the Managing Agency to the Permit Holder relating to access to intertidal areas; and
 - (iv) keep a copy of all Intertidal Area Notification Approvals provided to the Permit Holder under condition G28(i) with this permit.
- G29 The Permit Holder must not:
- (i) operate a vessel in the Vessel Exclusion Areas; or
 - (ii) operate an aircraft (including Remotely Piloted Aircraft) in the Aircraft Exclusion Areas listed in Attachment B, during the periods specified in Attachment B, unless otherwise approved in writing by the Managing Agency.

RESTRICTED ACCESS SPECIAL MANAGEMENT AREAS

- G30 A minimum of 14 days prior to accessing One Tree Island Reef (23-055) Restricted Access Special Management Area, the Permit Holder must:
- (i) obtain written approval from the Resident Officer* of One Tree Island Reef Research Station;
 - (ii) provide the written approval to permitscompliance@gbmpa.gov.au; and
 - (iii) comply with any directions given by the Managing Agency in relation to such access.

**The Resident Officer can be contacted by calling the One Tree Island Research Station, using the telephone number provided on the publically available website for the Station.*

ACTIVITIES

- G31 The Permit Holder may only conduct the following educational activities, for the purposes for which permission(s) has been granted under this permit, in accordance with the conditions of this permit:

Educational Activities
marine turtle watching
photography, filming and sound recording
SCUBA diving
short, medium and long-term use of equipment
snorkelling
swimming
taking of animal species
taking of marine plant species
taking of marine products, coral rubble and reef rock
taking of plankton
video, visual and passive acoustic censuses

MARINE TURTLE WATCHING

- G32 When conducting marine turtle watching, the Permit Holder must ensure that all participants:
- (i) keep the use of lights to an absolute minimum and only use a small torch (no more than three (3) volts);
 - (ii) not approach or shine lights on marine turtles leaving the sea or moving up the beach;
 - (iii) avoid excess noise and sudden movement;
 - (iv) not corner, chase, handle, provoke or interfere with marine turtles; and
 - (v) only use flash photography on a marine turtle that is nesting once the marine turtle starts laying eggs.

PHOTOGRAPHY, FILMING AND SOUND RECORDING

- G33 When conducting photography, filming and sound recording, the Permit Holder must ensure:
- (i) any equipment or props are free-standing or hand-held;
 - (ii) all equipment or props are not fixed in place or left unattended, even temporarily;
 - (iii) free-standing equipment (such as tripods) or props do not come into contact with coral; and
 - (iv) the activity does not restrict public access or public use.

TAKING AN ANIMAL, PLANT OR MARINE PRODUCT

- G34 Taking must not be carried out in the Buffer Zones, Marine National Park Zones and Commonwealth Islands Zones.
- G35 Taking of plants, animals and marine products is only permitted when carried out in accordance with the following table:

Specimens which may be taken	Limit on taking (per calendar year)	Method of taking
Marine products, coral rubble and reef rock	no more than: (i) 20 litres of wet sediment; (ii) 100 litres of seawater; (iii) 5 kg of coral rubble; and (iv) 10 kg of reef rock	taking may only be carried out by: (i) hand; (ii) hand-held implement; ¹ (iii) water-sampling devices; ¹ or (iv) sediment-sampling devices ¹
Plankton	in accordance with condition G24	taking may only be carried out using: (i) non-fixed plankton nets; ¹ or (ii) light traps
Invertebrates excluding: (i) protected species; and (ii) species listed as 'no animals to be taken' in Schedule 6 of the <i>Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019</i> (Cth)	no more than five (5) specimens of an animal of a species	taking may only be carried out by: (i) hand; (ii) hand-held implement; ¹ (iii) apparatus or equipment, authorised under Queensland fisheries legislation for recreational use; ^{1,2} or (iv) sieves ¹
Fish excluding: (i) protected species; and (ii) species listed as 'no animals to be taken' in Schedule 6 of the <i>Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019</i> (Cth)	no more than five (5) specimens of an animal of a species	taking may only be carried out by: (i) hand; (ii) hand-held implement; ¹ or (iii) apparatus or equipment, authorised under Queensland fisheries legislation for recreational use ^{1,2}
Marine plants excluding taking of protected species	in accordance with the numbers of specimens permitted to be taken by Queensland fisheries legislation	taking may only be carried out by: (i) hand; or (ii) hand-held implement ¹

¹ the Permit Holder must ensure that it and all Affected Persons actively monitor the equipment (including keeping it within sight), remain close enough to be able to take control of the equipment within a few minutes and not use equipment that is motorised, pneumatically operated or hydraulically operated

² non-selective taking methods, being methods of taking that do not target a known individual specimen (e.g. seine nets, line and hook), must not occur within Scientific Research Zones

- G36 The Permit Holder must not return to the Marine Parks any plant, animal or marine product exposed to chemicals or showing visible signs of disease.

REPORTING AND NOTIFICATION

- G37 When undertaking the program in the vicinity of those places listed below, the Permit Holder must discuss the study areas with the appropriate person specified, and abide by any instructions provided:

- G38 The Permit Holder must submit an Educational Program Report via the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority's Permits Online Portal (or any other method approved by the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority):
- (i) within 21 days of a request from the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority; and
 - (ii) six (6) months prior to the expiry of the period for which the permission(s) is in force.

EXAMPLE PERMIT

INTERPRETATION

This permit extends to all employees of the Permit Holder, and other persons acting on behalf of or at the direction of the Permit Holder, for the purposes specified in this permit.

This permit is not intended to extinguish any native title.

Terms which are defined in the Dictionary have the meanings respectively ascribed to them.

A reference to any legislation or legislative provision:

- (a) is a reference to that legislation or legislative provision as in force from time to time; and
- (b) includes any statutory modification, substitution or re-enactment of that legislation or legislative provision.

A reference to anything after the words "include" or "including" does not limit what else might be included.

A note or heading may be used to give assistance in interpreting conditions in case of ambiguity.

A reference to a date includes that date.

DICTIONARY

'Affected Persons' means the Permit Holder and other persons who are acting on behalf of, or with the approval or at the direction of, the Permit Holder or for whom the Permit Holder is otherwise legally responsible.

'aircraft' has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975 \(Cth\)](#).

'Amalgamated Great Barrier Reef Section' has the same meaning as the 'Great Barrier Reef Marine Park – Amalgamated Great Barrier Reef Section' in the [Great Barrier Reef \(Declaration of Amalgamated Marine Park Area\) Proclamation 2004 \(Cth\)](#).

'Appropriate Insurance' means the following insurances:

- (a) public liability for not less than \$20 million arising from any one (1) event in respect of the death of, or injury to, persons or loss or damage to property; and
- (b) under all applicable laws relating to workers' compensation to cover workers, eligible persons, self-employed contractors, directors, trustees and partners.

'Appropriate Insurer' means an insurer that is:

- (a) registered with the Australian Prudential Regulation Authority and have a Standard and Poor's (S&P) credit rating of no less than A-; or
- (b) a non-Australian insurer with a S&P rating of no less than A-; or
- (c) another insurer with the written approval of the Managing Agency.

'aquatic devices' means motorised equipment which assists snorkelling and SCUBA diving activities, including motorised swimming aids (e.g. seabobs, diver propulsion vehicles) and underwater ride-on scooters (e.g. scubabobs, hydrobobs).

'Australian Prudential Regulation Authority' means a statutory body created under the [Insurance Act 1973 \(Cth\)](#) to regulate members of the finance, insurance and superannuation industry.

'Authority' means an authority granted in accordance with conditions G4 to G6.

'Baited Remote Underwater Video Stations' means stationary, seafloor camera stations which use bait to attract the fish in their vicinity, recording species attracted to the bait or just swimming past the camera lens.

'Buffer Zone':

- (a) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 \(Cth\)](#); and
- (b) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the [Marine Parks \(Great Barrier Reef Coast\) Zoning Plan 2004 \(Qld\)](#).

'Byfield Area' for the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park means those areas enclosed within the outer boundaries of the 'Planning Area' as defined in the Byfield Area Management Plan (2010), State of Queensland (Department of Environment and Science).

'Cairns Area Plan of Management' means the [Cairns Area Plan of Management 1998 \(Cth\)](#).

'Cairns Planning Area' has the same meaning as in the [Cairns Area Plan of Management 1998 \(Cth\)](#).

'Cairns/Cooktown Management Areas' means the geographical area defined by the Cairns/Cooktown Management Area of the Amalgamated Great Barrier Reef Section and the Cairns/Cooktown Management Area of the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park.

'Cairns/Cooktown Management Area of the Amalgamated Great Barrier Section' means that part of the Amalgamated Great Barrier Reef Section that lies:

- South of a line commencing at 14° 18.181' South, 144° 39.064' East, then running south-westerly along the geodesic to its intersection with the mainland coastline at 14° 39.909' South, 144° 56.564' East; and
- North of a line commencing at 17° 40.409' South 147° 17.013' East then running progressively:
1. south-westerly along the geodesic to 17° 52.809' South 146° 30.064' East
 2. west along the parallel to its intersection with the mainland coastline at 17° 52.810' South 146° 06.269' East.

'Cairns/Cooktown Management Area of the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park' means the area defined in Schedule 2, Part 4 of the [Marine Parks \(Declaration\) Regulation 2006 \(Qld\)](#).

'Claim' means a claim, action, suit, liability or demand of any kind for legal, equitable or administrative relief of any kind including for loss, damage, personal injury, death and associated costs and expenses.

'Claim Event' means an event or occurrence actually or potentially giving rise to a Claim.

'Commonwealth Islands Zone':

- (a) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 \(Cth\)](#); and
- (b) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the [Marine Parks \(Great Barrier Reef Coast\) Zoning Plan 2004 \(Qld\)](#).

'Conservation Park Zone':

- (a) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 \(Cth\)](#); and
- (b) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the [Marine Parks \(Great Barrier Reef Coast\) Zoning Plan 2004 \(Qld\)](#).

'coral' means any species in class Anthozoa or Hydrozoa.

'coral rubble' means dead coral skeleton or reef rock pieces that have fractured and been liberated by mechanical or chemical means and are larger in size fraction than sand (greater than two (2) mm).

'Council Foreshore Reserves' means a reserve defined by the [Land Act 1994 \(Qld\)](#), managed as a Foreshore Reserve by a local council.

'Educational Program' means the provision (whether as a single act or a series of acts) of transport, accommodation or services for a group or groups of six (6) or more persons (none of whom is a tourist) principally for the purpose of systematically educating those persons.

'Educational Program Report' means the educational program report prepared by the Permit Holder (or at its direction). It must include a record of all animals, plants and marine products taken from the Marine Parks, and equipment deployments, installations and removals conducted in the Marine Parks.

'environment' has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975 \(Cth\)](#).

'Far Northern Management Areas' means the geographical area defined by the Far Northern Management Area of the Amalgamated Great Barrier Reef Section and the Far Northern Management Area of the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park.

'Far Northern Management Area of the Amalgamated Great Barrier Reef Section' means that part of the Amalgamated Great Barrier Reef Section that lies north of a line commencing at 14° 18.181' South, 144° 39.064' East, then running south-westerly along the geodesic to its intersection with the mainland coastline at 14° 39.909' South, 144° 56.564' East.

'Far Northern Management Area of the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park' means the area defined in Schedule 2, Part 5 of the [Marine Parks \(Declaration\) Regulation 2006 \(Qld\)](#).

'fixing or fastening equipment' means equipment used to hold things together or to securely attach them to the seafloor, not including anchors.

'Great Palm Island Conservation Park Zone' has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 \(Cth\)](#).

'Habitat Protection Zone':

- (a) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 \(Cth\)](#); and
- (b) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the [Marine Parks \(Great Barrier Reef Coast\) Zoning Plan 2004 \(Qld\)](#).

'harm' has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975 \(Cth\)](#).

'Hinchinbrook Plan of Management' means the [Hinchinbrook Plan of Management 2004 \(Cth\)](#).

'Hinchinbrook Planning Area' has the same meaning as in the [Hinchinbrook Plan of Management 2004 \(Cth\)](#).

'incident' means an event within the knowledge of the Permit Holder involving actual or potential harm to the ecosystem in the Marine Parks, including but not limited to:

- (a) coral damage; or
- (b) cyclone damage; or
- (c) any shipping event that requires notification to a relevant authority under the [Transport Operations \(Marine Safety\) Act 1994 \(Qld\)](#), [Transport Operations \(Marine Pollution\) Act 1995 \(Qld\)](#) or the [Navigation Act 2012 \(Cth\)](#); or
- (d) any aircraft event that requires notification to the relevant Authority under the [Civil Aviation Act 1988 \(Cth\)](#); or
- (e) any discharge of untreated sewage effluent; or
- (f) any discharge of hazardous chemicals, fuel or biotoxic products.

'Indemnify' means indemnify and save harmless.

'intertidal area' means that area of the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park between mean low water and the landward boundaries of the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park.

'in the vicinity of' means:

- (a) for a specified bay, island or mainland, those waters and land between the high water mark on the coastline and a line every point of which is a distance of 1 kilometre seaward from that high water mark; or
- (b) for a specified reef, those waters and land enclosed by a line every point of which is a distance of 1 kilometre seaward from the reef edge of that reef; or
- (c) in relation to rivers, streams and inlets that part of those rivers, streams and inlets that are in the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park.

'island' includes islands, islets, cays, rocks and sandbanks.

'Keppel Island Group' means the area bounded by a line commencing at 23°00' South, 150°51' East and then running progressively:

- 1. east along the parallel to its intersection with longitude 151°01' East
- 2. south along the meridian to its intersection with latitude 23°14' South
- 3. west along the parallel to its intersection with longitude 150°51' East
- 4. north along the meridian to the point of commencement.

'location' means a discrete, identified reef, or a continuous non-reef area of up to 10 square kilometres.

'long-term use' means the use of permitted equipment for no more than 365 days in total during the period which this permit remains in force.

'Mackay/Capricorn Management Areas' means the geographical area defined by the Mackay/Capricorn Management Area of the Amalgamated Great Barrier Reef Section and the Mackay/Capricorn Management Area of the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park.

'Mackay/Capricorn Management Area of the Amalgamated Great Barrier Reef Section' means that part of the Amalgamated Great Barrier Reef Section that lies:

South of a line commencing at 19° 39.545' South, 150° 35.061' East then running progressively:

- 1. south-westerly along the geodesic to 20° 09.907' South 150° 20.061' East
- 2. southerly along the geodesic to 20° 29.907' South 150° 30.062' East
- 3. south-westerly along the geodesic to 20° 40.907' South 150° 10.063' East
- 4. north-westerly along the geodesic to 20° 33.908' South 149° 07.063' East
- 5. south-westerly along the geodesic to 20° 39.727' South 148° 45.813' East
- 6. west along the parallel to its intersection with the mainland coastline at 20° 39.727' South 148° 43.056' East.

'Mackay/Capricorn Management Area of the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park' means the area defined in Schedule 2, Part 2 of the [Marine Parks \(Declaration\) Regulation 2006 \(Qld\)](#).

'Managing Agency' means:

- (a) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority, a member of the staff of that Authority or a person referred to in Section 48A of the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975 \(Cth\)](#) performing functions or exercising powers under that Act in accordance with an agreement referred to in that section; and
- (b) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park, the Chief Executive of the Department of Environment and Science, his/her Delegate, an officer of the Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service, or a person referred to in section 52 of the [Marine Parks Act 2004 \(Qld\)](#), appointed as an inspector.

'Marine National Park Zone':

- (a) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 \(Cth\)](#); and
- (b) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the [Marine Parks \(Great Barrier Reef Coast\) Zoning Plan 2004 \(Qld\)](#).

'Marine Parks' means:

- (a) the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park established by the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975 \(Cth\)](#); and
- (b) the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park established pursuant to the [Marine Parks Act 2004 \(Qld\)](#).

'Marine Parks regulations' means:

- (a) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019 \(Cth\)](#); and
- (b) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park, the [Marine Parks Regulation 2017 \(Qld\)](#).

'marine product' has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 \(Cth\)](#).

'Maritime Cultural Heritage Special Management Area' has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019 \(Cth\)](#).

'medium-term use' means the use of permitted equipment for no more than 180 days in total during the period which this permit remains in force.

'motorised, pneumatically operated or hydraulically operated' includes implements that:

- (a) contain a sealed battery;
- (b) have small electrical or motorised parts such as timers and gears; and
- (c) incorporate small water pumps with water flow rates of less than 25 litres per minute.

'non-fixed' means not attached to the substrate or a fixed structure.

'One Tree Island Reef (23-055) Restricted Access Special Management Area' has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019 \(Cth\)](#).

'Palm Islands Group Habitat Protection Zone' has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 \(Cth\)](#).

'Pancake Creek' means the part of Pancake Creek that is within the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park and upstream of the line worked out by reference to the following points—

- (a) latitude 24°01.278' south, longitude 151°44.628' east;
- (b) latitude 24°01.368' south, longitude 151°43.836' east.

Note - The line worked out by reference to latitude 24°01.278' south, longitude 151°44.628' east and latitude 24°01.368' south, longitude 151°43.836' east crosses the mouth of Pancake Creek at high water.

'passive' in relation to equipment, means underwater slates and pencils; taxa ID cards; watches and timers; global positioning devices; data loggers (which are not greater than 500 millimetres in their longest dimension); sensors that do not emit significant electrical signals, sound, or light into the environment (e.g. secchi discs, digital thermometers, light meters and pH meters, dissolved oxygen and salinity meters); integrated transponder tag readers; transect tapes; quadrats; portable hydrophones; towboards; and standard, low power, recreational fish-finders and depth sounders when fish-finders and depth sounders are affixed to vessels.

'permit' means the permission(s) the subject of Permit Number PERMIT NUMBER number, and the associated conditions, granted to the Permit Holder pursuant to the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019 \(Cth\)](#) and the [Marine Parks Regulation 2017 \(Qld\)](#) as set out in this document.

'permitted activities' means the activities permitted by the conditions of this permit.

'permitted use' includes the activities contemplated by the permitted use.

'person' includes a natural person, a body corporate, a company or an incorporated association.

'pest' means any animal, plant, parasite or disease causing organism (such as bacteria, virus or fungus) capable of causing adverse impacts to environmental, economic or social values whether or not it is:

- (a) contributing to a Listed Key Threatening Process under the [Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 \(Cth\)](#); or
- (b) prohibited or restricted under the [Biosecurity Act 2014 \(Qld\)](#).

'photography, filming and sound recording' means low impact recording as defined in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority Activity Assessment – Photography, filming and sound recording Guidelines \(Cth\)](#).

'plankton' means small and microscopic organisms (often less than one inch) drifting or floating in the sea, consisting chiefly of diatoms, protozoans, small crustaceans and the eggs and larval stages of larger animals.

'Planning Area' means:

- (a) the Cairns Planning Area;
- (b) the Hinchinbrook Planning Area; and
- (c) the Whitsunday Planning Area.

'Planning Area location' means an area defined as a Location in the Cairns Area Plan of Management, the Hinchinbrook Plan of Management or the Whitsundays Plan of Management.

'Plan of Management' means a plan of management, as in force from time to time, that is prepared for the Marine Park in accordance with Part VB of the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975 \(Cth\)](#).

'Preservation Zone':

- (a) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 \(Cth\)](#); and
- (b) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the [Marine Parks \(Great Barrier Reef Coast\) Zoning Plan 2004 \(Qld\)](#).

'protected species' has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 \(Cth\)](#).

'Queensland fisheries legislation' has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 \(Cth\)](#).

'reef rock' means consolidated in situ skeletal rock produced through organic cementation.

'Remotely Operated Vehicle' means a vessel, aircraft or other vehicle which is directly controlled by a human operator who is not located in or on the vehicle. A Remotely Operated Vehicle may or may not be physically connected to the operator by a cable or tether. The phrase 'Remotely Operated Vehicle' is most commonly used to refer to underwater vehicles, but also includes remotely piloted aircraft such as drones.

'remotely piloted aircraft' means an unmanned aircraft other than a balloon or kite, where the pilot is not on board the aircraft.

'Restricted Access Special Management Area' has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019 \(Cth\)](#).

'Scientific Research Zone':

- (a) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 \(Cth\)](#); and
- (b) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the [Marine Parks \(Great Barrier Reef Coast\) Zoning Plan 2004 \(Qld\)](#).

'SCUBA diving' includes introductory and certified SCUBA diving activities and may include the use of aquatic devices in accordance with this permit.

'snorkelling' includes snorkelling in accordance with this permit with, or without, motorised diving aids.

'short-term use' means the use of permitted equipment for no more than 30 days in total during the period which this permit remains in force.

'site' means an area of 3,000 square metres within a location.

'Special Management Area' has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019 \(Cth\)](#).

'taking' an animal, plant or marine product has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 \(Cth\)](#).

'Townsville/Whitsunday Management Areas' means the geographical area defined by the Townsville/Whitsunday Management Area of the Amalgamated Great Barrier Reef Section, and the Townsville/Whitsunday Management Area of the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park.

'Townsville/Whitsunday Management Area of the Amalgamated Great Barrier Reef Section' means that part of the Amalgamated Great Barrier Reef Section that lies:

South of a line commencing at 17° 40.409' South 147° 17.013' East then running progressively:

1. south-westerly along the geodesic to 17° 52.809' South 146° 30.064' East
2. west along the parallel to its intersection with the mainland coastline at 17° 52.810' South 146° 06.269' East; and

North of a line commencing at 19° 39.545' South, 150° 35.061' East then running progressively:

1. south-westerly along the geodesic to 20° 09.907' South 150° 20.061' East
2. southerly along the geodesic to 20° 29.907' South 150° 30.062' East
3. south-westerly along the geodesic to 20° 40.907' South 150° 10.063' East
4. north-westerly along the geodesic to 20° 33.908' South 149° 07.063' East
5. south-westerly along the geodesic to 20° 39.727' South 148° 45.813' East
6. west along the parallel to its intersection with the mainland coastline at 20° 39.727' South 148° 43.056' East.

'Townsville/Whitsunday Management Area of the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park' means the area defined in Schedule 2, Part 3 of the [Marine Parks \(Declaration\) Regulation 2006 \(Qld\)](#).

'transiting' has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Regulations 2019 \(Cth\)](#).

'vessel' has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975 \(Cth\)](#).

'waters adjacent to' in relation to a reef, means the waters enclosed by 'the 500 metre line' and in relation to an island or the mainland, the waters enclosed by 'the coastal 500 metre line' (as defined by the zoning plan or Marine Parks regulation that applies to those waters).

'Whitsundays Plan of Management' means the [Whitsundays Plan of Management 1998 \(Cth\)](#).

'Whitsunday Planning Area' has the same meaning as in the [Whitsundays Plan of Management 1998 \(Cth\)](#).

'Zone':

- (a) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975 \(Cth\)](#); and
- (b) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park, has the same meaning as in the [Marine Parks Act 2004 \(Qld\)](#).

'Zoning Plan' means:

- (a) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, the [Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 \(Cth\)](#); and
- (b) in relation to the Great Barrier Reef Coast Marine Park, the [Marine Parks \(Great Barrier Reef Coast\) Zoning Plan 2004 \(Qld\)](#).
