Priotisation of future LMAC agenda items:

All LMAC members were given the Reef Authority Corporate Plan 24/25 Milestones and asked to take an individual vote on priorities of community importance to focus future LMAC meetings. The top three corporate milestones of interest across the LMAC network were:

- Milestone 1.3.1: Give effect to the Sustainable Fisheries Position Statement by actively engaging with government partners, industry, and community.
- Milestone 2.1.2: Prepare or update Marine Park policies for reef interventions, tourism, protected species and research to provide for the long-term protection of the Great Barrier Reef.
- Milestone 3.2.2: Work with partners to deliver actions in the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Heritage Strategy and strengthen alignment with the Reef 2050 Traditional Owner Implementation Plan.
