In 2023 we are celebrating 20 years of the Reef Authority's Reef Guardian School program.

20 years of teaching and learning to raise awareness, understanding and appreciation for the Reef and its connected ecosystems.

20 years of positive actions from schools and local communities, contributing to Reef protection and resilience.

In the 20 years of the program, over 330 schools have been involved across Queensland and more than 350,000 students have attended a Reef Guardian School since 2003.

Get creative

Here are some ideas for how to use the 20-year visual in your school and classroom.

Screen Printing

Use the logo as a stencil and screen print sustainable products such as:

- **Calico tote bags or drawstring bags**
These could be used as library bags or for beach clean-up events.
- **Canvas pencil cases or zip bags**
Students could create a Reef-themed design to complement the 20-year logo.

T-shirt/Hat

Use the Reef Guardian School | 20 year lock-up on commemorative shirts and/or wide rim hat for 2023 cohorts.

Showcasing your school

Communicating about your school's involvement in the Reef Guardian School program in 2023

We encourage you to keep your school community informed about the great work you and your students are doing, further amplifying the positive impact you are making through your participation in the program.

To this end, we have prepared some key messages and example posts and templates to help you do this. You can use the key messages in social media posts, school newsletters or any other way you would like to share your Reef Guardian School's story with your school community. You are also welcome to use the drafted posts and templates as they are, or adapt these to best suit your requirements.

Key messages about the program

- The Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority's Reef Guardian School program began in 2003 to educate students, teachers, and their communities about the Great Barrier Reef and the threats to its sustainable future.
- The Reef Guardian School program provides teaching and learning opportunities that create awareness, understanding and appreciation for the Reef.
- Reef Guardian Schools have a proud history of achieving a wide range of Reef guardianship actions, such as engaging in citizen science activities to survey the health of coral reef ecosystems, planting native species to enhance habitat revegetation, reducing marine debris through beach clean-up events, and implementing recycling programs.
- The Reef Authority provides educational resources that cover a range of topics to teach and learn about the Great Barrier Reef including climate change, sea country connections, sustainability, wetlands, threats to the Reef, and biodiversity.

Key messages about your school's involvement in the program.

- Our school is a Reef Guardian School, and we encourage teachers and students to undertake positive actions at school and in our local community to contribute to Reef protection and resilience. Our school has been involved in the program for XX years.
 - We educate our students and the school community about the relationship between our everyday actions and the health of the Great Barrier Reef, inspiring our students and their families to make a positive difference in the environment.
 - As a Reef Guardian School, we are part of a collaborative network of like-minded schools. We complete an annual action plan and share our achievements on the Reef Guardian Schools portal.

- Our school is recognised by the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority as a school that participates in activities that help to protect the Great Barrier Reef.
 - Our involvement in the Reef Guardian School program sees us participate in the CLASS pillars of Reef guardianship:
 - **CARE** for the Reef and foster a sense of shared responsibility
 - **LEARN** to increase knowledge and understanding about the value of the Reef, how it is managed and the threats to its future
 - **ACT** for environmental sustainability and appreciate that all actions collectively matter
 - **SHARE** learnings with others to encourage wider positive influence, and act as
 - **STEWARDS** of the Reef, to build Reef resilience for future generations.
 - The Reef Guardian School program has been in operation for 20 years and is now expanding its reach to inspire teachers, students and their communities all over the world to help protect their local reefs and waterways.

Here are some ideas on the types of posts you can create to get you started.





